Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Healthy Schools Act (HSA) 2016 School Health Profiles

The CDC and HSA School Health Profiles assess school health policies and practices in states, large urban school districts, territories, and tribal governments.

CDC Profiles are conducted every two years by the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE), among middle and high school principals and lead health education teachers within public and public charter schools. HSA Profiles are conducted annually as required by section 602 of the Healthy Schools Act (L18-0209).

All Profiles Surveys shall be completed online no later than February 15, 2016 at 5:00 pm.

- Two separate surveys are required: Principal Survey & Lead Health Education Teacher

About the HSA SHP

- Required by the *Healthy Schools Act of 2010*
- Ensures compliance with the HSA
- Data used for reporting, informing technical assistance, monitoring, and evaluation.





HSA SHP Content

- Section 1: School Profile
- Section 2: Health Services
- Section 3: Health Education Instruction
- Section 4: Physical Education Instruction
- Section 5: School Nutrition and Local Wellness Policy
- Section 6: Distributing Information
- Section 7: Environment

Key Questions

- Question 16 (Grades K – 8)
 - Average minutes for **health education** over entire year. Separate from physical education minutes if taught in the same course.
- Question 21 (Grades K – 8)
 - Average minutes for **physical education** over entire year. Do NOT include recess, before, or after school.
- Question 22 (Grades K – 8)
 - Average **physical activity** minutes for over entire year. Includes only time of activity in the physical education course. Do NOT include recess, before, or after school.

Key Questions (Continued)

- Questions 17, 23 (Grades 9 – 12)
 - Report in **Carnegie Units**.
- Question 24 (Grades 9 – 12)
 - Report average **physical activity** minutes within the physical education course.
