In-Depth School Garden-Cafeteria-Classroom Training

Time: 90 Minutes

Summary: An overview of the School Garden and Farm to School services available from OSSE through the requirements of the Healthy Schools Act. An introduction to the School Garden Coordinator, with a sample lesson and activity outside in the school garden where teachers will have the opportunity to explore the space. This training includes an interactive discussion about the correlation between what is growing in the garden and what is served in the cafeteria, troubleshooting common problems, participation in district-wide events and additional sample lessons are also included. This training is intended for schools who are already utilizing their school garden in the cafeteria and classroom, but are struggling with increasing or maintaining this involvement.

11. Cafeteria Connection (10 minutes)

a. Working with the School Garden Coordinator, discuss techniques for communicating the correlation between what's growing in the garden and what's being served in the cafeteria

12. Troubleshooting Existing Problems (20 minutes)

- a. Have participants share current problems occurring with utilizing the school garden in the cafeteria and the classroom
- b. Allow participants, the school garden coordinator and the trainers time to provide feedback and suggestions on these issues.
- c. Include activities during Growing Healthy Schools Week and Strawberries and Salad Greens Day as methods to increase participation and unity within the school environment surrounding school gardens and consuming local foods.
