

# A Toolkit and Strategies for Communicating with Parents about the NCSC Alternate Assessment and Related Curriculum and Instructional Resources

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# Importance of Communication

- Encourage support for LEA and school role in the NCSC project
- Avoid unnecessary concern and possibly a backlash
- Gain goodwill from the parent community for transparency and efforts to raise expectations for students
- Encourage parent involvement and home-school collaboration

## Wiki Resources

- **Curriculum Resources** - What to Teach; Curriculum Resources are reference materials created to reinforce educators' understanding of content.
- **Instructional Resources** - How to Teach; Instructional Resources are reference materials created to support classroom teaching and learning for students with significant cognitive disabilities, and provide broad coverage of topics of interest to educators and parents.
- **Educator Professional Development and Parent Resources** – **Presentations** and **interactive modules** designed to supplement professional development and learning for students with significant cognitive disabilities, and provide broad coverage of topics of interest to educators and parents.

# Explain Changes to Expect in Instruction

- Can be handled in LEA/school-wide meeting, parent-teacher conference or in materials sent home
- Slides from PowerPoints on <http://www.ncscpartners.org/resources> can be used for a presentation
- Suggest providing a hard copy of the *NCSC Project Description*, *NCSC Discussion of College and Career Readiness for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities*, and the *NCSC Diagram and Explanation* documents

# Additional Suggestions for Explaining Instructional Changes

- Emphasize that instruction on Common Core State Standards does not ignore functional goals – they are embedded in academic instruction (the most important one is communicative competence)
- Share how the NCSC wiki provides resources to support general/special educators, including instructional strategies and supports
- Direct parents to Parent Tips and Tools link on wiki
- Provide parents with printed materials from the wiki that reference instructional strategies

# Explain Changes to Expect in Assessment PRIOR to IEP Meeting

- Can be handled in LEA/school-wide meeting, parent-teacher conference or in materials sent home
- Slides from PowerPoints on <http://www.ncscpartners.org/resources> can be used for a presentation
- Provide parents with *The NCSC IEP Team Guidance for Alternate Assessment Participation Decisions*
- Also suggest providing *Summary of NCSC Frequently Asked Questions regarding the Alternate Assessment, NCSC Answers to Common Parent Questions about Alternate Assessments, and NCSC Assessment Policies*

# Assessment Discussion at IEP Meeting

- Respond to remaining parent questions or concerns
- Address any resistance to NCSC assessment due to LRE concerns: point out FAQ #4 of the *NCSC IEP Team Guidance for Alternate Assessment Participation Decisions*, which states that participation is not a reason for educating a student outside the general education classroom
- Inform parents whether participation in the NCSC assessment will impact their child's opportunity to earn a regular high school diploma and discuss options for addressing any disagreement about the assessment decision

# Purposes of 2015 NCSC Alternate Assessment

- Understand how all the students perform on the full range of the expected content for a grade and on the full range of items, from easy to hard
- Collect data on how many students get each item right
- Use the data to design stage adaptive assessments that accurately show where students are in terms of learning the content they are expected to be learning

# General Suggestions for Sharing Parent Resources

- Provide links to Parent Resources on NCSC Partners website and NCSC wiki
- Have a binder of all these materials available at each school for parents without internet access
- Provide accessible versions and versions in other languages, as needed
- Explain that some of the Parent Resources provide the minimum information that every parent should have (e.g. Project Description, IEP Team Guidance, Assessment Policies), while others provide additional details
- Provide LEA or school contact info for questions
