Re: Paid Lunch Equity: School Year 2015-2016 Calculations and Tool

#### **State Agency Memo**

#### **NSLP #03-15**

According to 7 CFR 210.14 (e), School Food Authorities (SFAs) must ensure efficient funds are provided to the nonprofit school food service account for meals served to students who pay for meals. This memorandum and attached tool will help SFAs determine 2015-2016 paid lunch prices.

# SY 2015-2016 Paid Lunch Equity Calculations

If SFAs are charging less than \$2.70 for paid lunches in SY 2014-2015, they are required to adjust their lunch price or add non-Federal funds to the nonprofit school food service account. The increase in paid meal prices must equal 4.19(%) percent from SY 2014-2015.

If SFAs chose not to increase their paid meal prices for SY 2014-2015, they must add the shortfall to the SY 2015-2016 paid lunch price.

# **Use of Non-Federal Funds**

If SFAs choose to use non-Federal funds to contribute to the paid meal price, they must use the following calculation to determine the amount of revenue in lieu of paid lunch price increase: total number of paid reimbursable lunches claimed for the previous school year multiplied by the difference between SY 2015-2016 paid lunch price and the SY2014-2015 weighted average paid lunch price.

Sources of non-Federal funds include reimbursement from any non-Federal payment by an outside organization for paid meals or credits to paid meals from direct payments made from SFA funds to support lunch service.



## SY 2015-2016 Paid Lunch Equity Tool (PLE)

Please see the first tab of the SY 2015-2016 PLE tool for instructions and necessary information for completion. Additional information on other tabs is also included, such as weighted average paid lunch price for SY 2014-2015, required paid lunch price increase for SY 2015-2016 and required non-Federal source contribution required for SY 2015-2016.

In SY 2015-2016, SFAs now have the option to split the paid lunch increase by using both a meal price increase as well as non-Federal contribution.

To use the attached SY 2015-2016 PLE Tool, SFAs should have the following information:

- SY 2014-2015 Unrounded Price Requirement <u>OR</u> SY 2010-2011 weighted average price (all SFAs)
- All paid lunch prices for October 2014 (all SFAs)
- Number of paid lunches associated with each paid lunch price for October 2014 (all SFAs)
- Total number of paid lunches served in SY 2013-2014 (non-Federal source contribution only)
- Total dollar amount of SY 2011-2012, SY 2012-2013, SY 2013-2014 and SY 2014-2015 non-Federal contribution (non-Federal source contribution only)
