Session Descriptions



Secondary Transition Institute

The purpose of the Secondary Transition Institute is to equip educators with the tools, resources, and connections they will need to prepare youth with disabilities to successfully make the transition to postsecondary education, employment, and independent living. During the morning, participants will have the opportunity to review District-wide and individual LEA transition-related data and discuss challenges and solutions to providing quality services to transition-aged youth. In addition, new resources will be shared, including two toolkits designed to assist educators and service providers with the process. The afternoon will consist of case studies and hands-on activities to allow participants to gain familiarity with these new tools and understand how these resources can supplement their daily practices.

Nonviolent Crisis Intervention Training

The *Nonviolent Crisis Intervention* training program, developed by CPI, is embraced worldwide as a highly effective behavior management system for organizations committed to providing quality care and services in a respectful, safe environment. The strategies taught in the *Nonviolent Crisis Intervention* training program provide stakeholders with a proven framework for decision making and problem solving to prevent, de-escalate, and safely respond to disruptive or assaultive behavior.

Universal Design for Learning

Universal Design for Learning (UDL) is a research-based framework for designing curricula—that is, educational goals, methods, materials, and assessments—that enable all individuals to gain knowledge, skills, and enthusiasm for learning. This session will support teachers' efforts to meet the challenge of diversity by providing flexible instructional materials, techniques, and strategies that help teachers differentiate instruction to meet these varied needs using the Internet and multimedia. Participants will individualize teaching materials to make learning engaging and challenging for students with varied backgrounds, learning styles, abilities, and disabilities.



Session Descriptions (cont'd)



Effective Behavior Support Basics Webinar

We will discuss Section 504 of the 1973 Rehabilitation Act and IDEA as they relate to discipline. Trainers will review the legal definition of a removal, a change in placement, and manifestation determination reviews. We will also look at the effect trauma has on behavior and mitigating the impact of traumatic stress. Finally, trainers will review the core concepts of Positive Behavior Support and tiered intervention planning on an individual and school-wide basis. Additionally, trainers will discuss the principles of Functional Behavioral Assessments (FBAs) and the development of Behavior Intervention Plans (BIPs).

EXPLORE (dis)Ability

EXPLORE (dis)ABILITY is the DC Special Education Co-operative's interactive traveling exhibit that promotes inclusion and disability awareness in schools. Through hands on activities and guided discussions, EXPLORE assists school communities (students, teachers, and parents) in positively "re-imagining" how children with disabilities are perceived. Participants will:

- Interact with EXPLORE's 2 learning stations
- Discuss challenges to and solutions for creating classrooms that have positive and inclusive cultures
- Learn strategies and activities for promoting inclusion in classrooms

Special Education Quality Review (SEQR) Tool Webinar

OSSE's Division of Specialized Education (DSE) partnered with the American Institutes for Research (AIR) to launch a project designed to address special education program quality in the District of Columbia. From that work, AIR developed the Special Education Quality Review (SEQR) Tool, a web-based self-assessment tool to be used by schools, local education agencies (LEAs) to assess school-level programs for Students with Disabilities (SWDs) on selected quality indicators and to identify school level improvements needed to achieve best practice standards. This webinar will explain how to use the tool.
