



This report summarizes the 2011 **Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rates**¹ for District of Columbia (DC) schools. The 2011 graduation rate population is defined as high school students who began their high school academic career as first time ninth graders in 2007-08 and earned high school diplomas within four years.

Table 1 illustrates by school the overall graduation rates for the graduating class of 2010-11. The rates provide the combined average of DC Public Schools (DCPS) and DC Public Charter Schools (PCS). Overall, the 2011 state average is 58.58 percent. This is significantly higher than the predicted average (43.0) computed by Editorial Projects in Education Research Center (EPE).²


