DC Public Library Services Offered During COVID-19 Pandemic

You can:

- Return materials.
- Pick up a book on reserve.
- Check out books from our Grab-n-Go selection.
- Have a book paged from the stacks.
- Get a library card.
- Pick up a print job.
- Sign-up to use a limited number of computers for a 45-minute session once per day.
- Use the bathroom.

DC Public Library Services Not Currently Offered During COVID-19 Pandemic

You cannot:

- Browse the collection.
- Sit and read/study/work at a table or lounge area.
- Copy and scan.
- Use meeting or study rooms.
- Attend in-person programs or events.

Getting a Library Card

You can sign up for a temporary library card online here: https://www.dclibrary.org/getacard.

You can come in to a branch and get a library card - you will need a picture ID and proof of address.

Your DC library card expires every three years. However, recently all library card expiration dates have been extended to Feb 1, 2021.

Books and Materials - all late fees have been eliminated.

The library still charges for lost books.

Educator Cards

An Educator Card is a special card offered to educators.

Main Benefits:

- Check out a total of up to 100 books and audiobooks for children, young adults and adults.
- Borrow the books for nine weeks from any DC Public Library location.

To get one:

- Educators first must come to one of the open libraries, fill out an application and present proof of employment as an educator.
