

### **Test Preparation & Training**

Prior to administering the ACCESS for ELLs or Alternate ACCESS for ELLs Assessments, Test Administrators (TAs) must complete required online trainings in the <u>WIDA Secure</u>

<u>Portal</u>. Test Coordinators who also serve as a Test Administrator must complete all required trainings.

- In order to set up an account for any training courses in the WIDA Secure Portal, contact your LEA test
- You must take the Test Administrator Training Quizzes, with a passing score of 80 percent, in order to administer ACCESS/ALT ACCESS.
- in order to administer ACCESS/ALT ACCESS.

  Once you have taken the training course and passed the quiz, only the Speaking scoring training course and its corresponding quiz must be retaken every year (ACCESS for ELLs Paper, K ACCESS, and Alt ACCESS).
