### **Policy Reminders and Updates**

### **Chapter 30 Did You Know: Reevaluation Timeline**

- The local education agency (LEA) must conduct a reevaluation of each student with a disability to determine continued eligibility at least once every three years, unless the LEA and parent agree it is unnecessary, or if the LEA or parent initiates a reevaluation sooner. (5A DCMR §3007.1)
- Reevaluations conducted prior to the triennial reevaluation must be completed within 60 calendar days of parental consent. (5A DCMR §3007.5)
- LEAs must respond to a parent's request for a reevaluation within 10 business days by:
  - Beginning reasonable efforts to obtain parental consent to reevaluate; or
  - Providing prior written notice (PWN) refusing to proceed with the requested reevaluation. (5A DCMR §3007.4)



### **2023-24 School Year Early Access to Students with Disabilities Data Application**

This data application gives LEAs timely and appropriate access to information for preenrolled students with disabilities after the end of the current school year and prior to the start of the next school year.

Access is available to the eSchoolPLUS points of contact (POCs) below:

- LEA Data Managers
- Heads of School
- Principals
- Special Education POCs
- Pre-K Special Education POCs
- Early Childhood Transition Coordinators

The application became available on **April 26, 2023**, is updated daily and reflects changes in enrollment.



## Early Access to Students with Disabilities Data Application

Provides student demographic information from the Statewide Longitudinal Education Data (SLED) system as well as data points from the Special Education Data System (SEDS) including:

- Primary disability category
- Eligibility start and end dates
- IEP start and end dates
- Special education level
- Weekly service hours
- Related services: setting, time, frequency

- Assistive technology
- Least restrictive environment
- Dedicated aide and hours
- Transportation eligibility and mode
- ESY eligibility
- IDEA Part C services



### **Closing Out the 2022-23 School Year**

Prior to the end of the 2022-23 school year, LEAs should:

- Complete coronavirus (COVID-19) compensatory services decisions, as appropriate.
- Complete reevaluations and annual IEP team meetings that are due over the summer.
- Complete necessary documentation in SEDS.
  - Service logs, progress reports, prior written notices (PWNs) and summaries of performance for students graduating with a diploma.
- Identify a point of contact who can:
  - Respond to records requests from LEAs receiving students transferring from your LEA; and
  - Receive transition conference invitations and attend transition conferences for children transitioning from IDEA Part C early intervention services (C-to-B transition).



### Preparing for the 2023-24 School Year

To prepare for the 2023-24 school year, LEAs should:

- Submit Transportation Request Forms (TRFs);
- Monitor student enrollments through the Early Access to Students with Disabilities Data Application;
- Conduct an audit of your LEA's SEDS users;
- Ensure all necessary staff complete training on the new PowerSchool Special Programs (PSSP) system;
- Consult with your LEA Data Manager to ensure a smooth switchover of your student information system;
- Prepare for and document the first provision of specialized instruction for students with disabilities younger than age 6; and
- Prepare for the transition from SEDS to PSSP.
- Attend OSSE trainings, as appropriate.



### **Preparing for the Transition to PSSP – Policy Considerations**

- Consult with your LEA's Transition POC to develop plans for documentation and training.
- Update eligibilities and individualized education programs (IEPs) due within 30 days of your LEA's transition week.
- LEAs must update student records or documentation in statewide special education data systems no later than five business days after a change. (5A DCMR §3029.2)
  - Complete SY2022-23 service logs and progress reports.
  - Summary of performance 60 calendar days prior to graduation (5A DCMR §3028.5)
  - Extended school year (ESY) service logs and progress reports.
  - Upload assessments, student records, and other relevant documentation.
- Consider additional administrative burdens of working in a new system
  - Summer/start of school training for all relevant staff
  - Budget extra preparation time for annual IEP meetings



### **Physical Restraint Trainings**

- OSSE is again providing in-person training for certification in the Mandt System, a de-escalation and physical restraint training program. All trainings are provided by Onyx Therapy Group.



### Transportation Reminders and Updates

### **Transportation Requests Enhancements Training**

OSSE released the enhancements to the Integrated Data Submission (IDS) Tool Transportation Requests on Tuesday, March 8, 2023.

The enhancements consist of:

- The ability to update an individual student record
- The ability to transfer students between schools within a single LEA during the next school year transition
- The ability to submit the LEA and school calendar details
- Validation checks against authoritative data such as 504, CFSA and homeless
- Key metrics for managing student submissions

### **Students Being Migrated into Special Programs**

### **Migrate into Special Programs**

Migrate any student who, in the last five years, had a **special education event** (including active and inactive students) **AND** the student is 35 and younger as of the start of the LEA's zero week.

#### What is a Special Education Event?

A Special Education Event is defined as:

- Parental Consent;
- Referral;
- Eligibility;
- IEP;
- Referral Discontinuation;
- Parental Consent Discontinuation;
- Non-Eligibility Determination;
- Medicaid Parental Consent

# Where is the Data that is Not Being Migrated?

- OSSE will maintain all of the data that was not migrated.
- If the LEA needs access to students that were not migrated, an OST ticket will need to be submitted. OSSE will upload the student documents into <u>Box</u>. The SLA will vary based on the nature of the request.

## **Child Outcomes Summary (COS) Checkpoint**

All COS entry and exit data for the 2022-23 school year is due on Friday, June 30, 2023. To prepare for this checkpoint, LEAs should:

- Schedule a meeting with individuals who are most familiar with the student to collectively assess his/her abilities in the three functional skills areas.
- Confirm that you have completed all noted discrepancies from the January COS checkpoint.
- Complete exit data for every child who left your LEA during the school year or who will be promoted to kindergarten during the 2023-24 school year.

### Early Childhood Special Education Summer Referrals

The transfer of active and new referrals for children enrolling in your LEA began on May 1, 2023. Remember to:

- Acknowledge all new referrals in SEDS within 3 days of receipt of notification. The referral date is the date of notification.
- Participate in all Part C transition meetings.
- All special education related activities must continue even during your LEA's "Zero" week of the PSSP migration.

### Monitoring and Compliance

- Liaise with OSSE IDEA Part B Monitoring and Non-Public Team
- Ensure implementation of dispute resolution correction of noncompliance

#### **Evidence-Based Practice**

- Support LEA staff in leveraging OSSE resources on evidence-based practices in serving students with disabilities
- Share training opportunities with staff

#### Data Apps and Systems

- Serve as the SEDS administrator and trainer on behalf of all LEA staff

- LEA leaders may assign one or more staff members as the LEA SE POC and may divide duties to best meet the needs of the LEA.
- LEA SPED POCS must be <u>assigned this role</u> in eSchoolPLUS to receive official OSSE communications targeted to their role. Contact your LEA Data Manager to add your name and email to the <u>eSchoolPLUS contact list</u>.
