- Universal Design Elements
 - Available to all students
 - Provided by the test delivery system
- Accommodations
 - Available to only students on IEP, Section 504 Plan, or English language learners (ELL)
 - Divided into two types
 - Provided by the test delivery system
 - Provided outside the test delivery system



One-on-One/Small Group

- All students are interacting on a one-on-one basis with the tablet
 - Tablet administers the assessment to students
 - All students will receive earbuds to reduce distractions



Directions Only Read Aloud/Text-to-Speech (English)

• Available for all subjects



Read Aloud/Text-to-Speech (English) – Occasional or Most or All

Only allowed for mathematics

Universal Design Elements

Zooming

Up to 2X the default text/image size

Color Theming

- Default is black text on white background
- High contrast
 - White text on black background
 - Black text on beige background



Universal Design Elements

Scratchwork/Highlighter Capability

Embedded pencil and highlighter

 \checkmark



 Available for short standalone items (e.g., multiplechoice and short constructed response items)

Elimination Capability



 Available for multiple-choice items and the student questionnaire



Use a Computer/Tablet to Respond

Volume Adjustment

Closed Captioning

• All voice-over narration is closed captioned



Extended Time

- At their own pace
- Assessed in either regular session
- Limit is 3 times the amount of time allowed for the cognitive blocks



Magnification

- Screen magnifying software
- Magnifies **all** screen content

High Contrast for Visually Impaired Students

• High contrast form of the test



Low Mobility Version of the Test

• Keyboard navigable items

Hearing Impaired Version of the Test

• All auditory content closed captioned

Calculator Version of the Test

- Permits the use of a calculator on all items
- Only allowed for mathematics



Directions Translated to Spanish

• All directions including the tutorial



Only allowed for mathematics and reading

Directions Only Read Aloud/Text-to-Speech (Spanish)

- Must be paired with Directions Translated to Spanish
- Only allowed for mathematics and reading

NAEP DBA Accommodations Provided by the Test Delivery System

Spanish/English Version of the Test

- All content
- Only allowed for mathematics

Read Aloud/Text-to-Speech (Spanish) – Occasional or Most or All

- Must be paired with Spanish/English Version of the Test
- Only allowed for mathematics





Breaks During Test

- Predetermined intervals
- Must be given in a single day

Must Be Tested in a Separate Session

Must Have an Aide Present in the Testing Room



Uses Template

Cutout or overlay

Special Equipment

- Study carrel or portable screen
- Special lighting or furniture

Preferential Seating

Designated seating



Responds Orally to a Scribe

- Student responds orally or by pointing to his/her answers
- School staff member with whom the students typically works



Presentation in Sign Language

- Sign language interpreter provided by the school
- Only allowed for mathematics

Response in Sign Language

Student signs responses to a scribe provided by the school



Braille Version of the Test

- Paper/pencil version of the test
- Only allowed for mathematics and reading

Bilingual Dictionary

- Word-for-word translations only
 In any language
- Provided by the school
- Only allowed for mathematics



Other

- Read aloud to self
- Microphone

Not Allowed for Any DBA Assessments

- Tape-recording answers
- Taking the test over multiple days
- Rewording or simplifying test questions
- Speech-to-Text

- Read Aloud/Text-to-Speech– Occasional or Most or all
- Electronic Spellcheck and Thesaurus
- Presentation in Sign Language

- Bilingual Dictionary

Not Allowed for the NAEP 2017 DBA

Not Allowed for Mathematics

- Electronic Spellcheck and Thesaurus
- Use of an abacus, arithmetic tables, graph paper, or non-NAEP ruler





- Mathematics and Reading
 - Grades 4 and 8
- Accommodations
 - Only available to students on IEP, 504 plan, or English language learners

Extended Time

- At their own pace
- Assessed in either regular session or separate session
- Limit is 3 times the amount of time allowed for the cognitive blocks

Small Group

- Small number of students in the session
- Generally 5 or fewer students

One-on-One

Assessed without distractions

Accommodations Requiring Small Group or One-on-One

- Read aloud most or all in English
- Any portion of the assessment in Spanish
 - Directions
 - Questions/responses
- Breaks during the test
- Interaction with a teacher/aide
 - Scribe
 - Braille
 - Sign Language

Read Aloud in English – Directions Only

- Directions can be repeated or reworded
- Can be administered in the regular session or a separate session
- Also available to any student as standard NAEP practice (not as an accommodation)

Read Aloud in English – Occasional

- Words, phrases, or sentences read aloud
- Can use original booklet
- Administered in the regular session
- Only allowed for mathematics

Read Aloud in English – Most or All

- Requires most or all of the assessment read aloud
- Administered in a separate session by subject
- Only allowed for mathematics

Breaks During Testing

- As requested
- Predetermined intervals, in more than one sitting during a single day
- Administered in a separate session
- Must be given in a single day



Calculator Version of the Test

- NAEP accommodation since 2013 for mathematics assessments
- Administered in the regular session
- Also available with read aloud and the Spanish/English version of the test in a separate session



Must Have an Aide Administer the Test

- School staff member familiar to the student
- Assessed in a separate session
- Session scripts and instructions will be provided before assessment day

Responds Orally to a Scribe

- Student responds orally or by pointing to his/her answers
- Scribe records responses in booklet
- School staff member with whom the students typically works
- Administered in a separate session

Large Print Version of the Test

- Booklets provided by NAEP
- Enlarged to 129 percent
- Administered in the regular session



Magnification Equipment

- Provided by the school
- Arrange for equipment the student usually uses to be available on assessment day
- Some scanning systems may present security issues

Uses Template

- Template cutout or overlay
 - Cutout focuses attention on one part of the page
 - Overlay changes the color of the page
- Provided by the school

Preferential Seating

- Away from distractions
- Near special equipment
- At the front of the class

Special Equipment

- Study carrel or portable screen
- Special lighting or furniture
- Uses special writing tool
 - Large-diameter pencil, pencil grip or other special writing tool
- Uses a computer or typewriter to respond
 - Spelling and grammar check should be disabled

Presentation in Braille

Braille booklets provided by NAEP

Response in Braille

- Student records responses using a Braille output device, a slate/stylus, or electronic Braille note taker
- Uses a scribe to record responses
- Separate session



Presentation in Sign Language

- School staff member signs instructions (all subjects) and some or all of the test
- Only allowed for mathematics
- Administered in a separate session

Response in Sign Language

- Student signs his/her responses to a scribe
- Administered in a separate session

Bilingual Dictionary

- Non-computer
- Word-for-word translations only
 In any language
- Provided by the school
- Only allowed for mathematics

General Directions Only Read Aloud in Spanish

- Bilingual script instructions only (the same for all students)
- Separate session

Spanish/English Version of the Test

- Booklet provided by NAEP
- Test items side-by-side in booklet
- Administered in a separate session by a bilingual administrator
- Only allowed for mathematics

Test Items Read Aloud in Spanish

- Requires words, phrases, sentences, or the entire test read aloud in Spanish
- Uses Spanish/English version of the test provided by NAEP
- Administered in a separate session by a bilingual administrator
- Only allowed for mathematics



Other

- Read aloud to self
- Microphone

Not Allowed by NAEP (P/P)

Not Allowed for Any Subject or Grade

- Tape-recording answers
- Taking the test over multiple days
- Use of an abacus, arithmetic tables, graph paper, or non-NAEP ruler
- Rewording or simplifying test questions
- Use of a dictionary, thesaurus, or any spelling- or grammar-checking software devices

Not Allowed by NAEP (P/P)

Not Allowed for Any Subject or Grade

- Oral or written responses translated into written English
- Directions read aloud in the native language other than in Spanish
- Test material read aloud in the native language other than in Spanish
- Use of a bilingual version of the test other than Spanish

Not Allowed by NAEP (P/P)

Not Allowed for <u>Reading</u>

- Read Aloud Occasional in English
- Read Aloud Most or All in English
- Presentation of Test Items in Sign Language
- Bilingual Dictionary
- Spanish/English Version of the Test
- Test Items Read Aloud in Spanish
