- We have held **seven** CoPs this year.
 - **Two** of those CoPs had three concurrent sessions.

Webinars

• Providers had the opportunity to participate in **five** webinars focused on the CQIP.

Capital Quality 2017 Highlights











- **100 percent** of providers have started their CQIP in QuickBase and **all** Group 1 providers have completed it.
- 100 percent of Capital Quality providers attended all CoPs from March through August in-person or one-on-one with their quality facilitator.
- **95 percent** of CoP attendees agree that the content of the presentations from March through August was helpful.
- 27 percent of providers attended monthly non-mandatory webinars focused on navigating through QuickBase and My Teachstone.
- Quality facilitators provided at least **eight hours** each month of support to participating providers.
- \$150,000 was spent on curriculum materials and incentives for providers.
