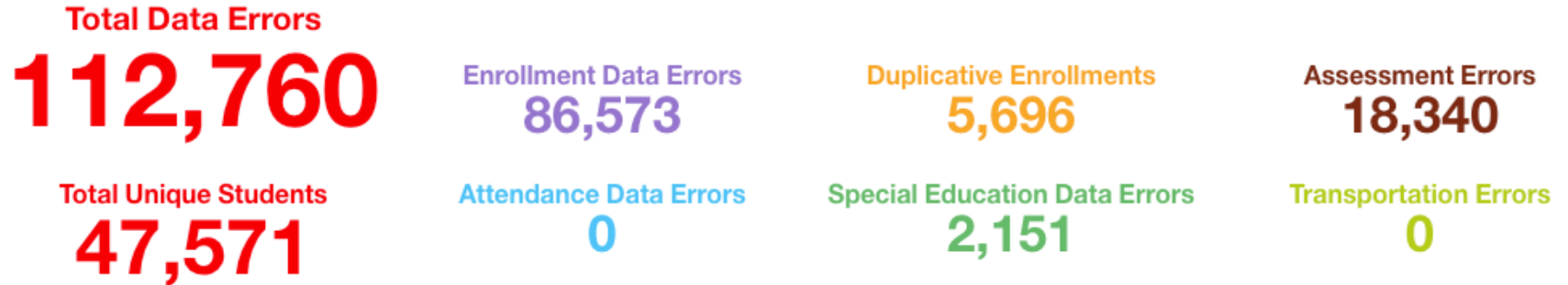
- ✓ All LEAs were connected and feeding to OSSE systems prior to their first day of school.

Metric Calculation Confirmation Policy SY 19-20



- Metric Calculation Confirmation (MCC) is the process by which LEAs review the calculations and metrics used on the DC School Report Card and used in other reports, analyses, and OSSE data files.
 - **MCC Phase III opens on Wednesday, September 9**
- The MCC Policy for SY 19-20 was sent to all LEAs on June 10, 2020, and is available on the OSSE website, as linked [here](#).
 - We have updated the MCC Policy to reflect the change of School Discipline data from the first data release in Phase III to the second data release in Phase III.

DC School Report Card – December 2020

Limited data displayed from SY 2019-20

- Profile Page: Enrollment, Physical Activity minutes
- Academic Performance: 4 and 5-year Grad Rate, College Enrollment rates
- School Environment: Teacher, School Leader, and Health Staff data

Report Card Display changes

- Profile Page:
 - Social Media will now include Instagram
 - School Hours should represent School Day hours, not Facility Hours – Based on hours as planned for December 2020 not August/September 2020
 - Times for Before and After Care will be published along with the information on funding model - Based on hours as planned for December 2020 not August/September 2020
 - AP/IB Programs – Only schools who are listed as certified providers by College Board or IB will be permitted to display this school program option, this is not per course, it is per school
- Teacher and Staff Data
 - N-count for teachers and school leaders for which data was provided will be included with the data published



Pandemic EBT

Pandemic EBT (P-EBT)

- Partnership with the Department of Human Services
- Expansion available for school days in August and September
 - Benefits would be \$125 per eligible student
- Several options being considered but to participate, LEAs must:
 - Participate in the National School Lunch Program for school year 2020-21
 - Complete their Stage V enrollment by 9/9



GEER Fund

Summary of Program

Who is eligible?

DC will pay for at home internet for households with school aged children enrolled at DC traditional and charter public schools that receive SNAP or TANF benefits.

Comcast and RCN both recognize SNAP and TANF as eligibility requirements for their low-cost internet programs.

How are we determining the address that will receive at home internet?

OCTO will be using the **student address** identified in the student information system as the household address for each student.

Students who are virtually learning from locations other than their primary address will need to be flagged by LEAs in a separate form before September 25.

What do families need to do?

The **primary guardian** will receive a call, text message, or email from

DC Government asking if they'd like to join the program and for consent to share their name, address, phone number, and email with the internet provider that will be providing their service, either Comcast or RCN.

Comcast or RCN will then contact the household to initiate the internet installation process. From the point of contact with Comcast or RCN the household should receive their install kit within 5-7 days.

Applications Considerations

SY20-21 Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund App (Qlik)

- Data are feed nightly from the LEA student information system (SIS).
- The application will refresh at 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. daily.
- Access is granted to the **head of school** and **LEA data manager**.
- The student address is considered as the connection address.
- Students who are both stage 4 and 5 and meet the eligibility criteria are included in the application.
- Only the parent/guardian(s) listed as the primary guardian will feed in the application. Only two primary contacts will be reflected.
- Use the time between today and Friday to ensure that the data are accurate and updated in the SIS.

Applications Considerations

SY20-21 GEER Fund Connection Address (Quick Base)

- This application should only be used when the Internet Connection Address is not the same as the student address.
- Data entered in Quick Base is fed to Qlik twice daily - 8 a.m. & 2 p.m.
- Only the **LEA data manager** will be granted access.
- The contact information for the new Student Connection Address is required; except Email, Apt. and Quadrant, when DC is not selected as the state.

- Review your students' data in the Qlik application for accuracy of the following fields:
 - Student Address
 - Primary Guardian is flagged in the SIS feed
 - Parent/Guardian Contact Information
