

OSSE 2019 College Starter Kit for Students Experiencing Homelessness

Purpose & Eligibility Criteria: The Office of the State Superintendent of Education's (OSSE's) Homeless Education Program is offering an opportunity for graduating high school students, who are experiencing homelessness to receive a College Starter Kit. The kit will include items such as a laptop, school supplies and other essential items to prepare a student for success in the first year of college.

Qualifications:

- 1. The students must have experienced homelessness during the 2018-19 school year.
- Students must have been identified as experiencing homelessness in the McKinney-Vento QuickBase application, Comprehensive Homeless Student Data application or by an advocate/case worker during the 2018-19 school year.
- 3. Students must show proof of acceptance into a college or university for the 2019 fall semester.

Instructions:

Applicants must submit a completed application packet (enclosed) which includes:

- 1. A completed cover sheet;
- 2. An essay (up to 1,500 words) about the impact of experiencing homelessness on their life and their desire to attend college (see essay evaluation criteria listed below);
- 3. A minimum of one letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, or other adult who can speak to the applicant's educational qualifications and life experience; and
- 4. Proof of acceptance into a college or university (e.g., acceptance letter, class schedule or housing confirmation letter).

Deadline: Applications must be submitted by email no later than <u>Monday</u>, <u>July 1</u>, <u>2019</u> to Tasheen Stallings, Tasheen.Stallings@dc.gov and Tiffany Williams Tiffany.Williams@dc.gov. Please note that this opportunity is available to recipients while supplies last.

Recipients will be notified regarding the application outcome and next steps via phone, email or information provided from the parent/guardian or school.

When will the College Starter Kits be awarded?

College Starter Kits will be distributed to recipients during a **mandatory** college send-off workshop on **Wednesday**, **July 31**, **2019** from **12-1:30** p.m. at the Office of the State Superintendent of Education, 1050 First St. NE, Washington, DC, 20002.

OSSE 2019 College Starter Kit Application

Here is what you need to submit by Monday, July 1, 2019:

1. 2019 College Starter Kit Application Cover Sheet:

Submit via email to Tasheen.Stallings@dc.gov and Tiffany.Williams@dc.gov

2. Essay:

Applicants must submit an essay about the impact of experiencing homelessness on their life and their desire to attend college (up to 1,500 words). Each essay will be evaluated on the following:

- Demonstrated commitment to education during the experience of homelessness;
- Academic achievement and accomplishments;
- Potential impact of the scholarship on the student's educational career;
- · Statement of goals and career interests; and
- Grammar and use of language.

Please note that the essay is one of the most important components of the application. Applicants must submit the essay as a Microsoft Word attachment to Tasheen. Stallings@dc.gov and Tiffany. Williams@dc.gov.

3. Proof of Acceptance into a College or University:

Applicants must provide evidence of acceptance into a college or university. Acceptable evidence includes an acceptance letter, a class schedule or a letter confirming housing. Documentation must be submitted via email to Tasheen. Stallings@dc.gov and Tiffany. Williams@dc.gov.

4. Letter of Recommendation:

Applicants must provide a minimum of one letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, or other adult who can speak to the applicant's educational qualifications and life experiences. Please submit the signed letter as a PDF attachment with the above requested items (Cover Sheet, Essay, and Proof of Acceptance into a College or University) via email to Tasheen.Stallings@dc.gov and Tiffany.Williams@dc.gov.
