

OSSE 2022 School Year College Starter Kit for College Bound Students Experiencing Homelessness

Purpose & Eligibility Criteria: The Office of the State Superintendent of Education's (OSSE) Homeless Education Program is offering an opportunity for graduating high school students who are experiencing homelessness to receive a College Starter Kit. The kit will include items such as a laptop, school supplies, and other essential items to prepare students for success in their first year of college.

Qualifications:

- 1. Students must have experienced homelessness during the 2021-22 school year.
- 2. Students must have been identified as experiencing homelessness in the LEA McKinney-Vento Database application or by an advocate/caseworker during the 2021-22 school year.
- 3. Students must show proof of acceptance and/or enrollment into a college or university for the 2022 summer/fall semester.

Instructions: Applicants must submit an application via email or via the <u>2022 OSSE College Starter Kit</u> <u>Opportunity Online Application</u>. A complete application includes the following:

- 1. A completed application form;
- 2. A personal essay consisting of 1,000-1,500 words about the impact of experiencing homelessness on your life and desire to attend college (see essay evaluation criteria listed below);
- 3. A minimum of one letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, or another adult who can speak to your educational qualifications (e.g., Advanced Placement classes, honor roll selection, academic improvement, standardized tests, academic certificates, or awards) and life experiences; and
- 4. Proof of acceptance into a college or university (e.g., acceptance letter, class schedule, or housing confirmation letter).

Deadline: Completed packets must be submitted through the <u>2022 OSSE College Starter Kit Opportunity</u> <u>Online Application</u> or emailed to <u>Tasheen.Stallings@dc.gov</u> by <u>5 p.m. on Wednesday, June 1, 2022.</u> This opportunity is available while supplies last.

Award Timeline: Recipients will be notified in July 2022 by phone, email, or other information provided in the application. Details on College Starter Kits distribution will be provided in the award notification and will be distributed to recipients no later than August 2022.

Recipient Check-ins: Students will be required to participate in scheduled virtual check-ins before the end of the fall and spring semesters (dates and time TBD) to monitor progress during the 2022-23 academic year.

Applicant has submitted an essay about the impact of experiencing homelessness on the student's life and their desire to attend college, consisting of a 1,000–1,500-word range. Essays must be submitted as a Microsoft Word attachment. Each essay will be evaluated based on the following:

- Demonstrated commitment to education during their experience of homelessness;
- Academic achievement and accomplishments;
- Potential impact of receiving the College Starter Kit on the student's educational career;
- Statement of goals and career interests; and
- Grammar and use of language.

3. Proof of Acceptance into a College or University
