
About A Wider Circle

Furniture & Baby Items

Most well-known service at AWC

Gently-used furniture, household items, & baby items free of charge

No qualifications to receive services

High demand & appointment-only



Professional Clothing

Known as "PDC" -Professional Development Center

Gently-used professional clothing free of charge

No qualifications to receive services

Services offered both on and off-site

Agency Relations

Process client referrals for furniture, baby items, and professional clothing

Develop relationships with agency partners

Assist with special or emergency requests

Resource Navigation

Connect clients to additional AWC services

Assist clients in finding and accessing resources within the community

Complete post-appointment follow up surveys

Partnership to Independence

Started in 2018, P2I is a long-term care program for families, with the goal of attaining economic self sufficiency.

Focus Areas:

- Career advancement
- Health and wellness
- Financial management
- Crisis navigation

The first cohort of P2I (15 participants) graduated last month and...

- 100% have stable housing
- 89% have increased their credit scores since 2018
- 73% are employed
- 4 participants are homeowners and 2 have been approved for mortgages
