



ACCELERATED LEARNING IN THE DISTRICT FOR THE 2021-22 SCHOOL YEAR

An analysis of 70 Continuous Education Plans (CEPs) submitted by District local education agencies (LEAs) showed:



X COMMUNITY PARTNERS

LEAs are partnering with a broad coalition of community partners and vendors.

28 LEAs report acquiring additional vendor/ community partner supports from 51 unique vendors or community partners.

TEACHER TRAINING

LEAs are preparing educators with training on new topics.

- 69% of LEAs plan to deliver new professional development for staff, covering over 35 topics.
- Training topics included culturally responsive teaching, accelerated learning strategies, and data- driven instruction.

SCHEDULING ADJUSTMENTS

LEAs are adjusting their schedules and calendars to accelerate learning.

- Of the 57% of LEAs changing their class block or bell schedules, the majority plan to add additional instructional or tutoring time, though some LEAs also plan to add time for social-emotional learning (SEL) supports, enrichment activities, English learner supports, and teacher planning time.
- Of the 54% of LEAs implementing after-school programming, 76% plan to provide academic supports, 55% will provide enrichment activities such as clubs or sports, and 21% will provide socialemotional learning (SEL) supports.



DEVICES FOR LEARNING


41% of LEAs (n=29) reported purchasing hardware or devices for students, including:

- 41% (12 of 29) purchasing laptops.
- 24% (7 of 29) purchasing new technology for concurrent learning, such as cameras for livestreaming class.
- 13% (4 of 29) purchasing hotspots for students and interactive classroom boards (e.g., Smartboards).

∼ KEY TRENDS

LEAs reported multiple strategies to accelerate learning. The below chart shows the percent of LEAs pursuing each.

LEA Accelerated Learning Strategies



74% of LEAs are hiring additional staff

52 LEAs plan to hire additional staff. The most common staffing positions were:

- Teachers or co-teachers
- Interventionists, specialists, or tutors
- Wraparound support staff

HIGH-IMPACT TUTORING (HIT)

60% of LEAs (n=43) plan to implement HIT.

- 58% (25 of 43) plan to offer HIT as part of the regular school day.
- 49% (21 of 43) will use ESSER federal pandemic relief funds.
- 47% (20 of 43) plan to offer the program for the entire school year.
- 37% (16 of 43) plan to partner with outside organizations to help administer HIT programs.
- **Literacy Lab** and **CityTutor DC** were the two most common partners.
