## **CARES-ESSER LEA Annual Reporting**

**Anticipated Federal Requirements as of Nov. 19, 2020**

Under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, the US Department of Education (USED) is required to complete an annual collection of data pertaining to the uses of funds under the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) fund. To fulfill this requirement, local educational agencies (LEAs) that received a [CARES-ESSER allocation](#) will be required to submit annual reporting data to OSSE. The information will be reviewed by USED to ensure that ESSER funds are used in accordance with section 18003(d) of the CARES Act and will be shared with the public to promote transparency regarding the allocation and uses of funds.

The below guidance, developed by OSSE, provides anticipated information on what will be required from LEAs in the CARES-ESSER annual reporting to OSSE. This guidance is based on the [ESSER Data Collection questions draft](#) that USED has released for public comment. As soon as the reporting requirements are finalized by USED, OSSE will update this guidance and provide a reporting template to LEAs.

### **Anticipated LEA Reporting Requirements:**

- 1. LEA Expenditure Data:** LEAs will be required to report their CARES-ESSER Expenditures during the reporting period by the Use of Funds categories in the table below. DCPS will also be required to report the amount expended on equitable services for nonpublic school students and teachers.

For the First Annual Report, OSSE will compile the amounts expended by category based on FY20 EGMS Reimbursements. OSSE will send this information to LEAs to validate in December after all FY20 reimbursement requests are submitted.
