

EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR CHILD DEVELOPMENT HOME STAFF

If you work at a licensed child development home in DC, you must meet certain education requirements depending on your position. As of Dec. 20, 2023, if you meet at least one of the degree/credential pathways listed below for your position, you can meet the requirements for your position. If you do not meet at least one of the degree/credential pathways listed for your position, help is available (see more below)!

POSITION	DEGREE/CREDENTIAL PATHWAYS
Expanded Home Caregiver	Associate degree (or higher) in early childhood education or a closely related field
	 Completion of at least 60 credit hours or an associate degree (or higher) in any subject area with at least 12 credit hours in early childhood education
	 Enrollment a degree program provided the Expanded Home Caregiver holds a Child Development Associate (CDA) and earns an associate degree (or higher) within four years of opening the expanded child development home
Home Caregiver	Child Development Associate (CDA)
	• State-award certificate comparable to a Child Development Associate (CDA) that is approved by the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE)
	 Associate degree (or higher) in early childhood education or a closely related field
	 Completion of at least 60 credit hours or an associate degree (or higher) in any subject area with at least 12 credit hours in early childhood education
Associate	Child Development Associate (CDA)
Home Caregiver	 State-awarded certificate comparable to a Child Development Associate (CDA) that is approved by OSSE
	• Completion of at least 60 credit hours or an associate degree (or higher) in any subject area
	 High school diploma or equivalent, provided the individual earns a Child Development Associate (CDA) within two years of their initial date of hire as an Associate Caregiver at a child development home or expanded child development home
