DAILY SCREENING QUESTIONS FOR FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN ATTENDING CHILD CARE

1. Is your child experiencing any new or unexplained symptoms from the list below? YES NO
- New or worsening cough
 - Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Fever (100.4° Fahrenheit or subjective)
 - Chills
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - Sore throat
 - Fatigue
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Runny nose or congestion
 - Diarrhea
 - Poor appetite or poor feeding
 - Abdominal pain
2. Has your child tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 10 days? YES NO
3. If your child awaiting a COVID-19 test result after experiencing symptoms of COVID-19? YES NO
4. Within the past 10 days, has your child had close contact with someone who is confirmed to have COVID-19? YES NO

If you answered **YES** to any of the questions

Your child must not attend child care in-person.

- Follow the child care facility's protocol to report your child's absence.
- If your child is experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, call their healthcare provider, who will determine whether COVID-19 testing is necessary.

If you answered **NO** to each question

Your child may attend child care today!

Please check with your child's child care facility for the facility's attendance policy if your child:

- Has a symptomatic household member awaiting COVID-19 test results.
- OR
- Has traveled in the last 10 days to any place other than Maryland or Virginia.²

1 If your child has a pre-existing health condition that presents with specific COVID-19-like symptoms, they may attend child care if a healthcare provider has provided written or verbal documentation that those specific symptoms are not due to COVID-19, provided that the answer is "no" to each of the other questions.

2 If your child did not attend child care for 7 days, got tested for COVID-19 3-5 days after returning to DC, AND received a negative COVID-19 viral test, then they may attend child care (provided that you do not answer "yes" to any of the other questions).
