Early Childhood Educator Minimum Education Requirements January 2024

Note: This report reflects data in the Division of Early Learning Licensing Tool (DELLT) as of Oct. 16, 2023 and is based on the minimum education requirements in the child care licensing regulations at that time and scheduled to go into effect on Dec. 2, 2023. On Dec. 20, 2023, the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) updated the minimum education requirements for the early learning workforce to include additional pathways for meeting the required credentials. Future reports will provide data on the numbers and percentages of staff meeting credential requirements as updated on Dec. 20, 2023.

In December 2016, OSSE adopted <u>child care licensing regulations</u> that increased the minimum education requirements for the early childhood workforce to ensure that staff meet the necessary qualifications and credentials to educate young children.

Center Director	Bachelor's degree (BA) in early childhood education (including early childhood development, early childhood education, elementary education, or early special education) or a bachelor's degree in any subject area with at least 15 semester credit hours in early childhood education.		
Teacher	Associate degree (AA) in early childhood education (or early childhood development, child and family studies, or a closely related field) or an associate degree (or higher) in any subject area with at least 24 semester credit hours in early childhood.	Dec. 2, 2023	
Assistant Teacher	Child Development Associate (CDA) or an associate degree (or higher) in any subject area.	Dec. 2, 2023	
Expanded Home Caregiver	AA in early childhood education (or early childhood development, child and family studies or a closely related field) or an associate degree (or higher) in any subject area with at least 24 semester credit hours in early childhood.	Dec. 2, 2023

The table below presents the numbers and percentage of current early childhood educators in each role who had achieved the minimum education credential for their position as of October 2023 as reported by employers in DELLT.

* The data reported above is based on staff members who met the minimum education requirements based on the Dec. 2, 2022 (for center directors) and Dec. 2, 2023 (all other positions) deadlines. These numbers and percentages do not include individuals covered by a 10-year continuous service or general waiver.
