

Title I Schoolwide Program Checklists

Title I of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires local education agencies (LEAs) implementing schoolwide models to develop a schoolwide program plan to improve educational programming and ensure all students meet academic standards, and demonstrate proficient and advanced levels of achievement.

This checklist may be used to ensure that a Title I schoolwide program and plan comply with the requirements of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). It may also be used to develop a local education agency's schoolwide program plan template for schools to use in developing, reporting and/or revising their plans.
