How to Navigate the Healthy Youth Resource Guide



Gold Standard for Youth Friendly Sexual Health Services

In an effort to identify organizations in the District of Columbia that offer youth-friendly sexual health services, OSSE and District of Columbia Public Schools (DCPS) conducted a series of youth secret shopper assessments. All secret shopped organizations were notified about the assessment beforehand and were offered the opportunity receive their results. Organizations that offered sexual health and family planning services were assessed for youth friendliness. Providers were ranked by three standards: gold, silver, and bronze. The overall ranking depended upon the number of stars the organization received per category. These categories include: call validity, disclosure, customer service, sexually transmitted infections (STI) testing services, and Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Questioning (LGBTQ) welcoming. These categories were aligned with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) 1308 Program guidance on "Promoting and Establishing Community Partners to Improve Student Access to Sexual Health Services".2



\star Gold Standard

Very Friendly: Responses to questions were very welcoming and positive. Organizations demonstrated superior customer service and knowledge of the services available to youth.

Silver Standard

Somewhat Friendly: Responses to questions were moderately positive and welcoming. Organizations demonstrated sufficient knowledge of services available to youth and provided good customer service.



Bronze Standard

Friendly: Responses were answered; however, degree of accuracy for the information provided was not clearly demonstrated.

Comprehensive Sexual Health Services

The HIV/AIDS Ribbon identifies organizations that offer comprehensive sexual health services, which include family planning, STI testing, counseling, education and outreach, and LGBTQ services and support. Examples of these organizations include Mary's Center and Unity Health Centers. You will find this symbol on the right side of the provider's profile page.



The School Bell identifies organizations that work with DC schools to ensure that students are connected to care outside of their school walls as a School Health Network Provider. You will find this symbol on the right side of the provider's profile page.



District of Columbia Minors' Rights to Health Services

A minor of any age may consent to health services which he or she requests for the prevention, diagnosis, or treatment of the following medical situations:

Contraceptive Services³

Minors 12 years and older may consent to contraceptive services.

Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI) Services

All minors may consent to STI services without their parent's or guardian's permission.

Prenatal Care⁴

All minors may consent to prenatal care.

Mental Health Services⁵

All minors may consent to mental or emotional health services.

District of Columbia's Minors' Right to Receive Health Care in School Based Health Centers⁶

For any student under 18 years of age, written parental consent to receive Health Services at the Center not covered by the Minor's Health Consent Regulation (22-B DCMR 600.7), and written consent to receive education records is obtained from that student's parent/guardian and maintained in that student's health record. Enrollment begins once signed consent forms are submitted to the school health provider, and ends when the student leaves the school, or when the Operator receives a written withdrawal from Center enrollment.

Key Terms for Providers

Before attempting to make a referral for your youth, please review the following terms to become more familiar with the referral process.

Anonymous Testing⁷

Personal identification will not be linked to a client's test results. Upon submitting to an anonymous HIV/STI test, an individual will be provided with a unique identifier allowing him/her to obtain the test results without providing personally identifiable information.

Barriers to Making Referrals

Youth indicated challenges that would prevent them for seeking services.

Case Management⁸

A collaborative process of assessing, planning, facilitating, monitoring, and advocating for options and services to meet an adolescent's needs through effective communication and coordination.

Case Management does not include activities that support legal functions, guardianship, child care, or other such services.

Confidential Services⁹

Service providers ensure that a patient's sensitive health information is kept in strict confidence and disclosure of information is not permitted.

Key Sexual Health Services¹⁰

Sexual Health Services that includes: HIV testing, sexually transmitted disease (STD) testing, STD treatment, pregnancy testing, provision of condoms and condom compatible lubricants (e.g. water- or silicone-based), provision of contraceptives other than condoms (e.g. birth control pill, birth control shot, IUD), and human papilloma virus (HPV) vaccine administration.

Referral¹¹

Describes a process of assisting youth in obtaining sexual health services through a variety of activities, including but not limited to connecting students to youth-friendly providers on the basis of an identified need.

Resource Guide

A reference list of local agencies that provide various services to DC youth and their families.

School-Based Health Center¹²

A health center on school premises where students enrolled (in the school) and their children can receive primary care, including diagnostic and treatment services, usually provided by a nurse practitioner or physicians' assistant.

Youth-Friendly Services¹³

Services with policies and attributes that attract young people, and create a comfortable and appropriate setting to address their health related needs. Youth-friendly services ensure confidential, respectful treatment and delivery of culturally-appropriate care in an integrated fashion at low or no cost and accessible to youth.

How to Make Referrals - Barriers and Recommended Solutions¹⁴

Below are common barriers and the suggested ways to help the program participant mitigate these barriers.

Fear

Reassure the youth that he/she is brave for taking steps to receive help.

Embarrassment

If the youth says that he/she is not comfortable sharing his/ her situation because he/she is embarrassed, reassure him/ her that the situation is not uncommon, and thank him/her for trusting you to share a problem so private.

Lack of Transportation

If a youth expresses concern with lack of transportation to receive services, refer to the Healthy Youth Resource Guide to identify the Metrorail or Metrobus stations located nearest to the provider. Call the identified provider and ask if the organization offers transportation assistance.

Lack of Child Care

Let the participant know that some agencies may provide child care. Call the identified provider to see if the organization offers child care. If not, discuss other options to receive child care.

Language Barriers

If a youth expresses concern with language barriers, refer to the Healthy Youth Resource Guide for translation services provided within the referred agency. If translation services are not available, inform the youth and together explore other possible options.

Cultural Differences

Make sure the referral agency is sensitive to the needs of people from various cultures.

Affordability


After identifying a provider, inform the youth if there is a fee or insurance requirement to receive the intended service. If the youth cannot afford the service, refer to the Healthy Youth Resource Guide to identify another program.

Inconvenient Business Hours


Help the youth find a provider that has business hours that are compatible with his/her schedule. Business hours are listed in the Healthy Youth Resource Guide to assist with this process.

Lack of Support

A youth may express that he/she is supported beyond the walls of your organization. Reassure him/her that there are caring individuals and organizations that want to help. Work with the youth to identify/create an additional emotional support network.

SEVEN STEPS TO SUCCESS: RECOMMENDATIONS FOR REFERRALS¹⁵



STEP 1: ASSESS

Ask the youth about their needs.



STEP 5: GIVE

Give referral slip to the youth and fill out an online referral to the selected provider.



STEP 2: PRIORITIZE

Ask the youth to identify what is their most pressing need if there are multiple.



STEP 6: ENTER

Enter the referral in the OSSE online referral system.




STEP 3: SELECT

Refer to the Healthy Youth Resource Guide to identify the appropriate provider.



STEP 7: FOLLOW UP

Check in with the youth within one month to determine whether the referral was completed.





STEP 4: PREPARE

Help the youth understand the referral and expected experience. Address their emotions and response.







n 2012, a total of 305,388 babies were born to women aged 15–19 years, for a live birth rate of 29.4 per 1,000 women in this age group. This is a record low for U.S. teens in this age group, and a drop of 6% from 2011. Birth rates fe I 8% for women aged 15–17 years, and 5% for women aged 18–19 years. While reasons for the declines are not clear, teens seem to be less sexually active, and more of those who are sexually active seem to be using birth control than in previous years.

Research indicates that when youth are victimized who either self-identify as lesbian, gay, bisexua, transgender and/or questioning(LGBTQ) or are perceived to be LGBTQ, they are at an increased risk for relational, mental health and substance use problems compared to their peers. Stigma, social prejudices and the related mistreatment of youth on the basis of their LGBTQ sexual orientation or transgender identity and gender expression contribute to a disproportionate number of LGBTQ youth facing negative health outcomes. As such, effective school- and community-based programs are needed that specifically target and meet the needs of the LGBTQ youth population.





Mental Health Services

The South Capitol Street Memorial Amendment Act of 2012 was passed in response to a mass shooting in the District of Columbia in 2010. This bill centers on improving mental health outcomes for DC youth and calls for the extension of behavioral health services to all public and public charter school students, enhances truancy regulations to ensure needed services are delivered to youth and increases behavioral health screening at local youth-serving agencies. Data-driven coordinated approaches for addressing the underlying sources of mental health difficulties among youth offer greater accountability and codified systems that can serve to assess andimprove youth emotional and mental health outcomes.

Office of the State Superintendent of Education

The Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) plays many roles in the lives of children, teens, and adults seeking an education in the District of Columbia. The agency sets statewide policies, provides resources and support, and exercises accountability for all public education in DC. OSSE ensures that the children and families receive year round access to well balanced meals by providing federal reimbursements, as well as training and nutrition education to program participants. OSSE also provides transportation to school for District children with special needs. OSSE administers programs that fund adult literacy education and has established college tuition programs that cover up to \$10,000 a year toward college tuition for eligible District students. There are countless programs, initiatives, and grants received as a result of the work done by OSSE all of which are listed on the OSSE website (osse.dc.gov), and all of which ensure that Washington, DC is a region where education comes first.

OSSE - Health Education Team

The Office of the State Superintendent of Education's Health Education Team (HET) works with school personnel, students, families, and community based organizations in order to improve the overall health of youth in District of Columbia Public Schools and Public Charter Schools. HET's goal is to equip personnel with the appropriate resources for healthy environments in school settings. This includes providing quality health and physical education to all District school students. The Health Education Team may be contacted at osse.hydt@dc.gov.

District of Columbia's Public Charter School Board

The PCSB's goal is to ensure that students and families in Washington, DC have access to quality public charter school education. It accomplishes this by setting tough academic standards, using a comprehensive charter application review process and effective oversight, providing meaningful support and actively involving parents, school leaders, the community and policy makers.

Before PCSB permits a public charter school to open, the nonprofit proposing to run it must commit — in writing — to the contribution it will make to DC's educational landscape. If the nonprofit fails to meet its goals, PCSB holds it accountable. Currently there are 112 public charter schools in Washington, DC, operated by 61 nonprofits. Created in 1996, PCSB is an independent body governed by the School Reform Act. The first public charter school opened in 1982.

PCSB is governed by a seven-member Board, appointed by the Mayor, with the advice and consent of the DC Council. The volunteer Board approves new schools, oversees schools while in operation, and revokes school charters if they fail to meet their performance goals. District of Columbia Public Schools' Office of Youth Engagement, Health and Wellness Team

The District of Columbia Public Schools' (DCPS) Office of Youth Engagement, Health and Wellness Team builds the capacity of schools to develop and coordinate health services and wellness strategies that empower students to stay engaged in their academics by making healthy decisions and living healthy lives.

Promoting Adolescent Health Through School-Based HIV/STD Prevention and Surveillance

OSSE has technical assistance opportunities available for DC Public Charter Schools in school-based HIV/STD prevention programming. This programming will increase the capacity of public charter schools to address HIV infection disparities through sexual health education, sexual health services, safe school environments, and effective policies. OSSE is also working in coordination with DCPS to support the implementation of the funded programs.

DC Personal Responsibility Education Program

The Office of the State Superintendent of Education offers five competitive DC Personal Responsibility Education Program (DC-PREP) sub-grants to organizations that implement evidence-based programs. These programs educate adolescents within the District of Columbia on both abstinence and contraception to prevent pregnancy, sexually transmitted infections (STIs), including HIV/AIDS, and at least three adulthood preparation subjects.

Funding Agency

The Department of Health and Human Services-Administration for Families and Children (ACF), Administration on Children, Youth and Families' (ACYF), Family and Youth Services Bureau (FYSB).

Population Served

The programs serve young people ages 11-19 in all 8 wards with specific focus on youth who are African American, Latin American, LGBTQ, low-income, male, and pregnant and parenting teens.

Long-Term Outcomes

- Decrease the number of pregnancies among adolescents under the age of 19 years.
- Decrease the number of births among adolescents under the age of 19 years.
- Decrease HIV/STI rates among adolescents under the age of 20.

Athletes United for Social Justice

The Grassroot Project (www.grassrootproject.org) is a local nonprofit organization that has worked in over 40 DC public and charter schools since 2009. Our Division 1 college athletes from Howard University, The George Washington University, Georgetown University, and University of Maryland are trained to deliver an interactive 8-week activity-based program focusing on HIV/AIDS prevention and life skills education. This program is intended for youth in grades 6-8 and ages 12-14. The athletes typically volunteer within a physical or health education class period, once a week over 8 weeks during Fall/Spring school semesters.



Children's National Medical Center

The Teen Life Clubs (TLC) (www.childrensnational.org) program was developed in 1997 as a means to promote health education among youth, as they entered their new found adolescence. TLC was established to target youth ages 11-14 with messages of self-esteem, empowerment, goal setting and decision making. Topics covered in the curriculum range from body image, nutrition, and exercise to violence prevention and early career skills building. These topics are divided into four units that make up the curriculum: personal identity, healthy bodies, violence prevention and making money/world of work. Sessions usually run over a period of thirteen weeks and delivered September to December, with the spring cycle covering programming from January-May.



Latin American Youth Center

The Sexual Wellness and Advocacy by Teens (SWAT) (www.layc-dc.org/index.php/programs/community-well-ness/health-promotion/teen-health-promoters.html) program provides sexual wellness and awareness workshops to a target population of youth ages 11 to 19 years old who access services at LAYC's DC anchor site (Ward 1) and the public and charter schools in which it works within Wards 1-4. SWAT aims to create an "army" of youth who are trained in healthy sexuality and reproductive health, including HIV/STI and unplanned pregnancy prevention. The program is based on the Popular Opinion Leaders model, a theory-based intervention that encourages the creation of opinion leaders in communities of youth who inspire those around them to create changes in behavior. For SWAT, these behaviors include engaging in safer sex practices, getting tested for HIV and STIs and talking more openly about sexuality with peers. The sessions usually run over a period of 10 weeks and are delivered from October to June.

Planned Parenthood of Metropolitan Washington

Planned Parenthood of Metropolitan Washington provides the evidence-based program SiHLE (Sisters Informing, Healing, Living, and Empowering) to African-American adolescent girls ages 11-19 from Wards 5-8. The goal of the SiHLE program (www.plannedparenthood.org/ppmw/teens-22988.htm) is to decrease the number of pregnancies and births, and to reduce the rate of sexually transmitted infections (STIs) including HIV/AIDS among adolescents ages 11-19 in Wards 5-8. This 8-10 program cycle entails three to four hour sessions at the Ophelia Egypt Program Center and partnering locations including public and charter schools. This Centers for Disease Control and Prevention-recognized intervention has interactive discussions, games, role-playing, is designed to reduce risky sexual behavior among adolescent African American females, while emphasizing ethnic and gender pride and enhancing awareness of HIV and pregnancy risk reduction strategies.





School-Based Physical Education /Activity and Nutrition Program

OSSE in partnership with the District of Columbia Department of Health's Community Health Administration plans to increase the number of schools that promote and reinforce healthful behaviors and practices across the life-span related to diabetes, cardiovascular health, physical activity, the consumption of healthful foods and beverages, and obesity in the District of Columbia. According to the Center for Diseases Control and Prevention, 24.1% of 10-17 year old children in DC are classified as obese, giving DC the 3rd highest rate of obesity in that age group. Obesity is an important epidemic impacting all of the United States.

Long-Term Outcomes

Improve the prevention and control of overweight and obesity cases in the District of Columbia.

Short-Term Outcomes

- Increase the adoption of physical education/activity and nutrition in K-12 public and public charter schools in the District of Columbia.
- OSSE will educate schools, community based originations, and government agencies in physical education/physical activity and nutrition related policies and standards.
- OSSE will assist schools in adopting physical education/physical activity and nutrition state level policies.
- Enhance the quality of physical education/ activity and nutrition in K-12 public and public charter schools in District of Columbia.



District of Columbia Public Schools Promoting Adolescent Health Through School-Based HIV/STD

In August 2013, DCPS was funded under a five-year, cooperative agreement with the CDC. The goals of this grant are the following:

- Reduce HIV and other STD infections among adolescents.
- Reduce disparities in HIV infections and other STDs experienced by specific adolescent sub-populations.
- Reduce teen pregnancy rates.

DCPS was funded to implement programming within four different approaches, within secondary schools with the highest need. Schools were prioritized by the Office of Youth Engagement based on: (1) 40/40 status; (2) DC CAS scores; (3) STI incidence rates; (4) homelessness data; (5) Free and Reduced Meals (FARM) data; and (6) feeder patterns.

Over the next five years, DCPS will engage the selected priority schools in implementing the following activities around four key approaches, as defined by the CDC.

The Four Program Approaches

- Exemplary Sexual Health Education
- Sexual Health Services
- Safe and Supportive Environments
- Educate Decision Makers on Policy and Implement/ Track Policy

Youth Advisory Committee

The Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) is comprised of high school students from public and public charter schools within the District of Columbia. The mission of the YAC is to develop a cadre of young leaders with critical thinking skills who will share knowledge and expertise around adolescent health issues. The YAC meets every week to develop youth led projects and ensure activities implemented are meeting the needs of young people in the District of Columbia. The youth are trained in a wide variety of topic areas including HIV, STD and Pregnancy Prevention, advocacy, domestic violence, how to be an LGBT ally, mental health, college preparation and financial aid.

School-Based STD Screening Program


The Department of Health's School-Based STD Screening Program (SBSP) provides once-a-year, urine-based and inschool STD testing and treatment to all high school students on an opt-out basis. Students are encouraged to call in for their results and DOH staff returns to the school about a week later to provide free, on-site treatment for students diagnosed with an active STD infection. Those students are also offered HIV and pregnancy screening. SBSP continues to improve and scale-up its existing efforts, including beginning to offer HIV testing on screening days and increasing the number of high schools that participate in the program.

Wrap M.C. (Master of Condoms) Condom Availability Program

The Wrap M.C. certification is an initiative of HAHSTA, DCPS, and OSSE. Members of the Wrap M.C. team are resource points for their schools, communities and peers in distributing condoms and educating on what condoms protect against, how to use them, and how to negotiate condom use with partners. School staff who wish to distribute condoms in schools must complete the online training and pass the post-test. Upon successfully passing the post test, HAHSTA provides staff with all materials needed to distribute condoms in the school. Students are encouraged to become a part of the Wrap M.C. program by becoming certified to promote condom use among their peers. Interested students should speak with the Wrap M.C. at their school or community organization for information specific to their school or program. HAHSTA will provide new Wrap M.C.s with condoms and other materials upon successful completion of the post-test.
