



2019-20 Administrative Review Summary

Section 207 of the federal Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act amended section 22 of the National School Lunch Act, requiring State Agencies to report final results of the administrative review to the public in an accessible, easily understood manner in accordance with guidelines promulgated by the Secretary.
