

## Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) School Climate Enhancement Grant: Allowable and Unallowable Use of Funds

## Allowable Use of Funds

Examples of how 24-25 grantees used microgrant funds strategically across various initiatives can be found here in the OSSE School Climate Enhancement Microgrant Learning Brief

- 1. School Climate Curriculum
  - a. Adopting or designing evidence-based School Climate/SEL curricula and planning for implementation.
- 2. Professional Development
  - a. Training programs and workshops for staff to improve school culture and climate.
  - b. Workshops and seminars on data analysis and interpretation.
  - c. Ongoing support such as coaching, mentorship, or access to external experts
  - d. Resources for continuous learning and development of staff.
- 3. Data Tools and Resources
  - a. Purchase of software, databases, and online platforms for developing SEL-aligned systems specific to DCSAYS domain(s).
  - b. Resources, and materials for implementing data informed decision-making processes.
- 4. Consultation and Expertise
  - a. Programs and partnerships with community business organizations (CBOs) to develop opportunities targeted to improve student experience aligned with a specific DCSAYS domain(s).
- 5. Engagement Opportunities for Stakeholders
  - a. Family and community SEL engagement events or series that contribute to a schoolwide initiative aligned with a specific DCSAYS domain(s).
  - b. Student-led climate and SEL initiatives (e.g., peer mentoring, restorative circles), targeted to address a specific DCSAYS domain(s).
- 6. Food
  - a. Food purchases in service of professional development and stakeholder engagement, not to exceed \$15/per person.

## **Unallowable Use of Funds**

- 1. Non-Educational Expenses
  - a. General office supplies not related to the grant's objectives.
  - b. Administrative costs unrelated to professional development or system implementation.
  - c. Swag or one-time general incentives (such as gift cards)
- 2. Infrastructure Expenditures
  - a. Construction or renovation of school facilities.
  - b. Purchase of furniture or other major equipment not directly related to grant activities.
- 3. Salaries and Stipends

- a. Payment of regular staff salaries or bonuses not specifically tied to grant activities.
- b. Stipends for tasks not aligned with the objectives of improving school culture and climate.
- 4. Entertainment and Personal Expenses
  - a. Costs associated with events, entertainment, or personal use.
  - b. Travel expenses not directly related to grant approved professional development activities.
- 5. Indirect Costs
  - a. General school operational expenses not specifically tied to grant activities.
