2025-26 Administrative Review Summary

Section 207 of the federal Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act amended section 22 of the National School Lunch Act, requiring State Agencies to report final results of the administrative review to the public in an accessible, easily understood manner in accordance with guidelines promulgated by the Secretary. Regulations at 7 CFR 210.18(m) require the State Agency to post a summary of the most recent final administrative review results for each School Food Authority on the State Agency's publicly available website no later than 30 days after providing final results of the administrative review. The State Agency must make a copy of the final administrative review report available to the public upon request.
