

OSSE'S DC DUAL ENROLLMENT CONSORTIUM PROGRAM

DC students have several opportunities to engage in dual enrollment programs, which allow them to take college courses, free of charge, while enrolled in high school, including through OSSE's DC Dual Enrollment Consortium Program (DECP) and OSSE's Districtwide <u>Advanced Technical Center</u>. Dual enrollment reduces college costs by enabling students to earn college credits while still in high school. In the 2023-24 school year, 458 students took 612 college courses worth more than \$616,000 in tuition at 13 colleges through OSSE's DECP.
