



RETURN TO SCHOOL CRITERIA

Note: These scenarios include the standard criteria to return to school for students and staff. Individual guidance from DC Health or a healthcare provider should always supersede these criteria. 
Scenario 1: Student or Staff Member with COVID-19 Symptoms¹

Note: This scenario requires exclusion until return criteria are met.




Scenario 2: Student or Staff Member with a Positive COVID-19 Test Result³

Note: This scenario <u>requires</u> exclusion until return criteria are met.



Scenario 3: Student or Staff Member with a Negative COVID-19 Test Result After Symptoms of COVID-19

Note: This scenario requires exclusion until return criteria are met.




Scenario 4: Student or Staff Member with Documentation from Healthcare Provider of Alternate Diagnosis After Symptoms of COVID-19




Scenario 5: Student or Staff Member is a Close Contact of an Individual with Confirmed COVID-19⁵



Note: This scenario recommends exclusion until return criteria are met.



Endnotes

- 1 See OSSE's COVID-19 Exclusion and Dismissal Criteria and Protocols for Schools for detailed information on symptom-based exclusion criteria. Students or staff with pre-existing health conditions that present with specific COVID-19–like symptoms must not be excluded from entering the school building on the basis of those specific symptoms, if a healthcare provider has provided written or verbal documentation that those specific symptoms are not due to COVID-19.
- 2 Standard criteria to return after illness refers to the individual school's existing policies and protocols for a student or employee to return to school after illness.

- 4 Regardless of whether symptomatic or asymptomatic, close contacts (including all members of the household) must not attend school until they meet the criteria to return per Scenario #5.

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Special Considerations

Individuals who have Recently Recovered from COVID-19

Provided that they do not currently have any symptoms consistent with COVID-19, an individual who has **tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 90 days** may return to school immediately in the following circumstance:

- 1. After close contact with someone with confirmed COVID-19,
- 2. When a symptomatic household member is awaiting COVID-19 test results, or
- 3. After travel.

Any individual with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 must follow Scenario #1.

Individuals who are Fully Vaccinated Against COVID-19

Provided that they do not currently have any symptoms consistent with COVID-19, an individual who is **fully vaccinated** against COVID-19 may return to school immediately in the following circumstances:

- 1. After close contact with someone with confirmed COVID-19,
- 2. When a symptomatic household member is awaiting COVID-19 test results, or
- 3. After travel.

A person is considered fully vaccinated 14 days after completion of a COVID-19 vaccination series (after the second dose of a 2-dose series, or after one dose of a single-dose vaccine).

Any individual with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 must follow Scenario #1.
