- Introductions
- Review of purpose, expectations, norms, and timeline
- Discussion of history and purpose of the UPSFF
 - o Review of UPSFF structure: foundation, weights, add-ons
 - o Review of other sources of LEA funding
 - Question about what percentage of LEA funding comes from the UPSFF.
 Roughly 80-90% of funding comes from the formula. Other sources of funding include federal, other local sources, and private funding.
- Presentation about the city's annual budget process
 - Annual budget process is a 10-month process
 - o 130 DC agencies are funded in the city's budget
 - The education sector or cluster accounts for almost 30% of the city's overall local funding (which includes the full education cluster - DPR, OSSE, DPL, UDC)
 - Comparison of LEA funding between FY08 and FY19, which has increased from 14% to 20% of the District's local budget - the main drivers of the increased funding is an increase in enrollment plus an increase to the UPSFF foundation rate and add-ons
 - No other agency is funded on a per person (in this case, student) basis, like it is for public education

 - Analysis of special education expenditures
 - No 504 budgeting
 - o English Learner (EL) funding
 - Updating weight
 - Increase in EL students in the District
 - o Creating a "supplemental" budget line in the UPSFF
 - At-risk funding
 - At-risk funding vs. summer school funding
 - Concentrations of poverty vs. student-weighted
 - Revising at-risk definition (new weights, overlapping weights)
 - Overlap between At-risk vs. free and reduced lunch population
 - Special need residential funding
