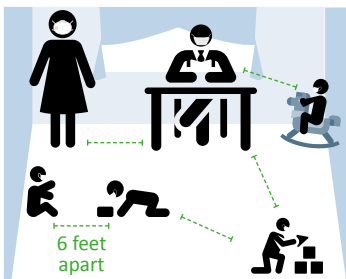


WHAT TO EXPECT AT YOUR CHILD CARE PROVIDER DURING COVID-19

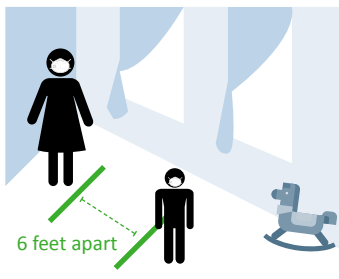
GROUPS OF 12 PEOPLE OR LESS.



FREQUENT CLEANING AND DISINFECTING.



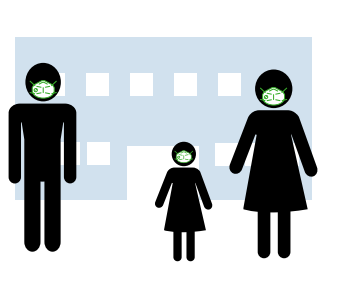
PHYSICAL DISTANCING.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP AT THE DOOR OR CURBSIDE.



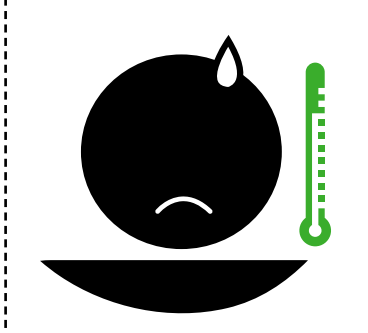
DAILY HEALTH SCREENINGS.
