Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate: The four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate is the number of students who graduate in four years with a regular high school diploma divided by the number of students who form the adjusted cohort for the graduating class. For any given cohort, students who are entering ninth grade for the first time form a cohort that is subsequently “adjusted” by adding any students who transfer into the cohort later during the next three years and subtracting any students who transfer out, emigrate to another country, or are deceased during that same period.

Enrolled in DC Schools SY2016-2017: The number of students who re-enrolled in a DC public or public charter school in SY2016-2017, who did not graduate in four years. Please note that this statistic is based on current enrollment and does not reflect the official Enrollment Audit Count as these data have not yet been verified by LEAs.

Other Credential or Attending College: The number of students in the cohort who received an IDEA Certificate or State Diploma, but who are not included as graduates in the official ACGR calculation. Please note that college enrollment data is not available for students entering ninth grade in the 2012-13 school year.

Educationally Disengaged: The number of students in the cohort who did not graduate, are not currently enrolled and did not receive an IDEA Certificate or State Diploma.
