In January and February of 2019, my child participated in the eight-week African Math: Red Blog – Introduction to African Numeracy course.

The class sessions were organized and well thought-out, always keeping in mind the pace of the students. The instructors' have a contagious love for math and ancient African history that shines through before, during, and after each class session.

The instructors frequently requested feedback, and made modifications when necessary. They were accessible whenever I had questions and genuinely cared about the progression of my child.

The course also benefitted me, as a homeschooling parent. I have learned better teaching approaches that can be applied to all teaching subjects, and our learning sessions have become more enjoyable for the both of us.

Although my child already had a basic understanding of counting and simple addition before the course, he has now achieved mastery of those topics. Now he has a solid understanding of what numbers are, how they work together, and how they can be used in everyday life – no memorization required. He is more confident and comfortable with math and enjoys playing his Sticks & Stones game.

Even older children will benefit from the Introduction to African Numeracy course. As an adult, my understanding of math, how numbers work together, and my ability to quickly solve math puzzles has improved as a result of this course.

One of my favorite parts of the course was the instructors' ability to creatively incorporate ancient Kemetic history into the learners' playbooks. Both my child and I have a better understanding of the Kemetic culture and a deeper sense of pride about the black contribution to the birth and prosperity of the world.
