Emergency Funds and Prior Years' Unpaid Balance Requests

What is the DC Futures Program Emergency Fund?

The DC Futures Program (DC Futures) Emergency Fund allows DC Futures participants enrolled in college to request up to \$2,000 each year they participate to address emergency expenses that may cause personal and financial barriers to college completion. DC Futures students must apply for the funds through their university. If the university approves the application, funds should be available within a few days. DC Futures students can also make a one-time request of up to \$1,500 to pay down a previous year's unpaid balance at an institution of higher education. While emergency fund payments are not guaranteed, they are available until exhausted.

- Emergency expenses include food, housing, childcare, transportation, health and safety needs and learning resources.
- Previously unpaid balance funds are intended to enable DC Futures students to access transcripts and credits that can be applied to their current major or program.

Emergency Funds and Previous Years' Unpaid Balance Requests:

DC Futures students can request further information from their coaches and from their university's financial aid office about emergency fund applications. Only DC Futures participants enrolled in college can make emergency fund and previous years' unpaid balance fund requests for more than one year of unpaid balances at previously attended institutions of higher education.
