# Exceeding the 1 Percent Cap

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires that **no more than 1 percent** of the total number of students in a state be administered the alternate assessment.

In the District of Columbia alternate assessments include:

- Multi-State Alternate Assessment (MSAA)
  - English Language Arts (ELA)
  - Mathematics
- DC Science Alternate Assessment





# Exceeding the 1 Percent Cap

LEAs that contribute to the state exceeding this 1 percent cap **must submit additional information** to the Office of the State Superintendent of Education justifying the need to exceed the 1 percent threshold. LEA justifications are required by USED in order for OSSE to apply for a state-level waiver to exceed the 1 percent cap.

On **Oct. 29**, LEAs that exceeded the 1 percent alternate assessment cap for the 2017-18 school year will receive two documents in Box:

- Exceeding 1 Percent Justification Memo
- Exceeding 1 Percent Justification Form

LEAs must complete these documents and submit them securely to OSSE via Box by **Nov. 9**.



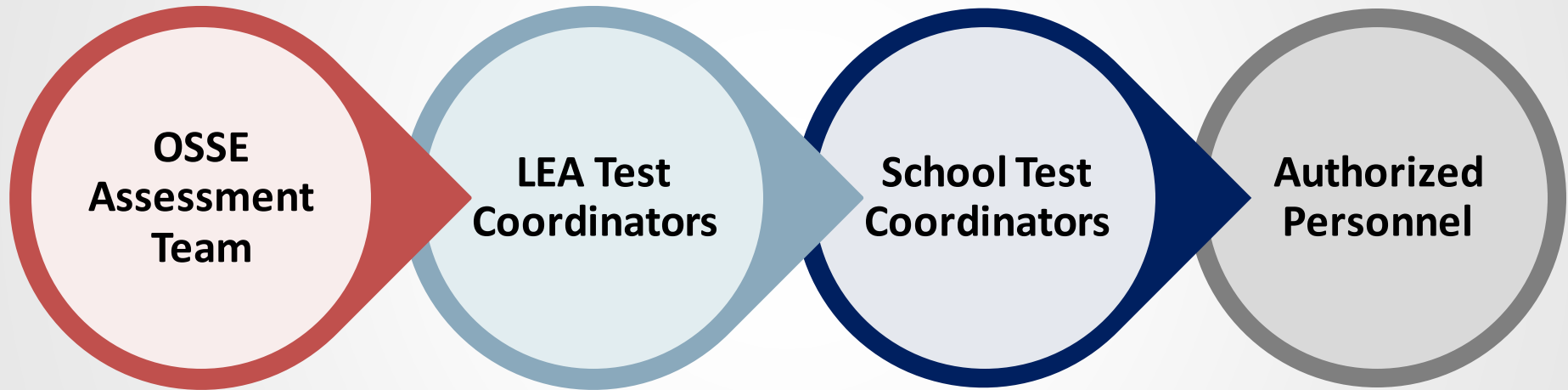
