

NAEP 2015 Overview

- Main NAEP Year:
 - National, State, & TUDA Reporting
- Assessment window
 - January 26, 2015 to March 6, 2015
- Participation Expectations
 - 19,000 schools
 - 970,000 students
- Operational assessment and special studies
- Single Assessment Date
- Timed test, not “speeded”



NGA Transitions Include NAEP

Why NAEP?

- Largest continuing and nationally representative assessment of what our nation's students know and can do in various subject areas
- Results reported as the Nation's Report Card
- “Common Yardstick” providing clear picture of student academic progress over time




