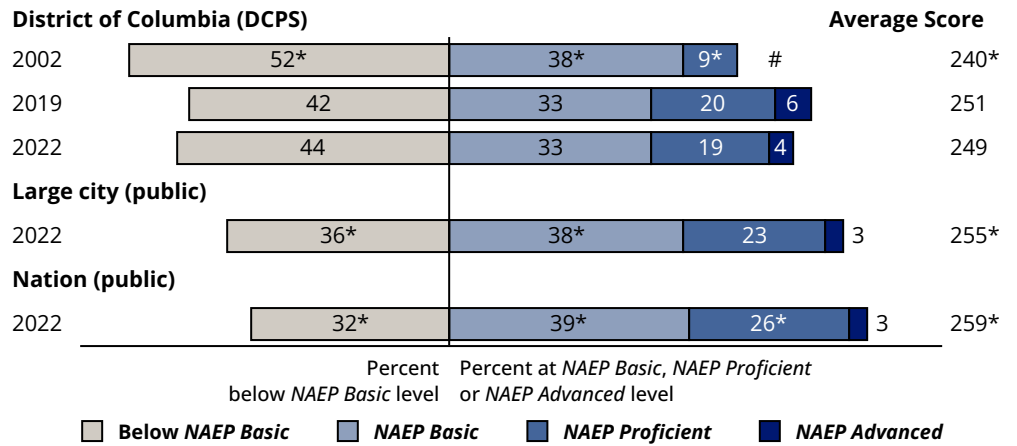


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of eighth-grade students in District of Columbia was 249. This was lower than the average score of 255 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in District of Columbia in 2022 (249) was not significantly different from their average score in 2019 (251) and was higher than their average score in 2002 (240).
- The percentage of students in District of Columbia who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 23 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (26 percent) and was greater than that in 2002 (10 percent).
- The percentage of students in District of Columbia who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 56 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (58 percent) and was greater than that in 2002 (48 percent).

NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS



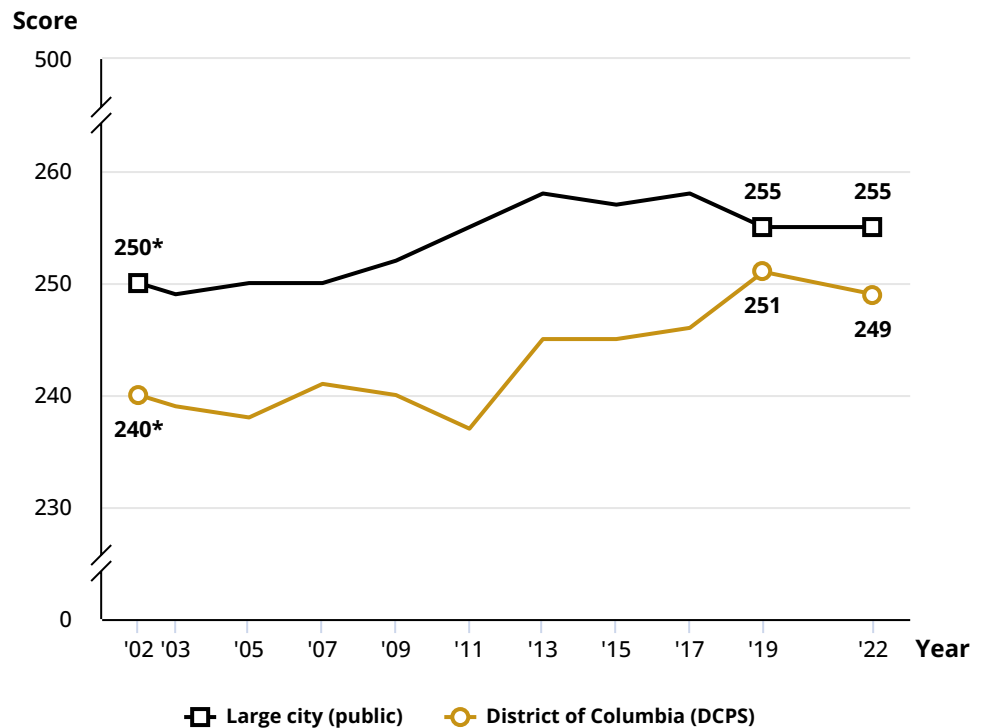

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 51 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for White students in 2002, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 51 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for White students in 2002, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2022, male students in District of Columbia had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 12 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 43 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was wider than that in 2002 (17 points).
