OSSE needs feedback but parents but parents won't know how to give the state what they want if they can't even know what they mean. Keep in mind illiterate parents, parents that speak different languages but can't read in their native language and essentially using some pictures and charts so that parents can find the groundwork out and "what is ESSA" and "what does this mean for your kid". More visuals are needed. State level results for different states- per the PARCC testing (is there a website that they can do • to?) SAP requested a copy of OSSE PowerPoint. SAPSE member Vivian Guerra stated she had a slide of vision trajectory that would be helpful • when displaying information to parents and stakeholders that have disabilities. • The SAP was informed that there are key beliefs and ideas that help guide OSSE in creating a system. Key items include focusing on all students, example, STAR: School, Transparency, Academic and Results. Do families believe that they are being served? We want to have families come back and believe that they are being served. SAP was notified that the draft ESSA plan would be on the website (insert date) and that SAP was encouraged to submit formal comment.
