### **Office of the State Superintendent of Education Trainer Approval Program (OSSE TAP) Trainers Approved to Provide CCDF Health and Safety Trainings**

Child care staff must complete annual health and safety trainings that meet child care licensing and Child Care Development Fund (CCDF) program requirements. Trainings must be completed through organizations or individual trainers approved by the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE). The trainers included below are certified through OSSE TAP to provide training on one or more of the [12 CCDF health and safety topics](#). On the table below, each column represents one of the 12 required CCDF health and safety topics and each row represents an OSSE TAP certified trainer. Available trainings are denoted by an X in the column of the specific health and safety topic in the row of the OSSE TAP certified trainer. For example, AIR Child Care Training Solutions offers courses in emergency preparedness and response and child development.

Participants may need to pay a fee, register in advance, or join a membership program to access courses. Trainers offering free courses and/or memberships are marked by asterisk (\*).
