- All staff members must possess a current and valid certification in First Aid and CPR.
- Two staff members at the premises are readily available to administer First Aid and CPR (exception: six children or fewer with only two children under the age of two.
- All first aid equipment and supplies must be maintained clean and in a sufficient quantity based on the size of the facility, the ages and developmental abilities of enrolled children, and the facility's program of activities.
- All first aid equipment and supplies must be maintained in a designated location readily available to staff and inaccessible to children.
- Inspection of first aid supplies should occur weekly and be replenished (e.g., removal and replacing sterile supplies if opened, used, damaged, or expired).
- A Licensee shall ensure that a transportable first aid kit is taken along by facility staff on each outing, and when children under the care and supervision of the facility are being transported.
