

Division of Education Excellence 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) Grant Program Volunteer Grant Reviewer Application

Overview

The District of Columbia Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) is seeking qualified grant reviewers to volunteer for its upcoming 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) competitive grant application process. Qualified candidates will possess one or more the following:

- Comprehensive knowledge of the impact extended-day learning opportunities have on improving the academic achievement of students.
- Experience in working with a variety of community members to forge meaningful partnerships that foster commitment to improving the lives of our youth and their families.
- Previous experience as a grant reviewer and/or as a grant recipient (federal or private funds).

Reviewers will be required to:

- Participate in at least one of two teleconference training sessions scheduled for Friday, April 11, 2008 and Friday, April 18, 2008.
- Review no more than 3 grant applications from May 2 through May 9, 2008.
- Complete a rubric and submit comprehensive comments, for each of the grant applications they review and submit them to OSSE by Friday, May 9, 2008.

During the grant application process, the selected reviewers are expected to perform the following activities:

- Read and evaluate proposals utilizing the OSSE review rubric.
- Provide detailed explanations regarding the evaluation scores based on the OSSE rubric. This includes constructive comments on the strengths and weaknesses of said proposals.

If interested, additional opportunities may be available to participate in on-site interviews of applicant finalists.

21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) Grant Program

The 21st Century Community Learning Centers Program establishes or expands *community learning centers* that provide students with academic enrichment opportunities along with activities designed to complement the students' regular academic program. Community learning centers also offer families of these students' literacy and related educational development. Centers provide a wide range of high-quality services to support student learning and development. Such services include tutoring and mentoring, homework help, academic enrichment (such as handson science or technology programs), and community service opportunities, as well as music, arts, sports and cultural activities. At the same time, these centers help working parents by providing a safe environment for students when school is not in session on weekends, evenings, before school, holidays, and in the summer.
