

Community Schools Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes March 26th, 2013 4:00-6:00 pm

The meeting commenced at approximately 5:00 pm after the Committee members were sworn in by Mayor Vincent Gray

A. Opening Remarks, Kevin Clinton, Chief Operating Officer, Federal City Council

- a. The purposes of the Community Schools Initiative Incentive legislation:
 - i. Advising the Mayor on the future prospects for employing the community schools model on a larger scale throughout DC
 - ii. Developing the criteria that will be utilized to select the grantees
 - iii. Foster a coalition of support for the Community Schools movement in D.C.
- b. Opportunities and challenges of employing Community Schools model:
 - i. Provide for the greater alignment of resources to serve students
 - ii. Enhance the coordination of student service to service students better
 - iii. Support neighborhood based programs in neighborhoods where there are more charter schools and fewer traditional public schools
 - iv. Leverage our communities investment in state-of-the-art school buildings

B. Marty Blank, Director, Coalition for Community Schools

- a. An overview of the community schools model was discussed and several resources were provided to the Committee
- b. Components of a successful community school were discussed:
 - i. Goal of community schools is alignment of services
 - ii. Supportive Principal is essential
 - iii. Schools should have an MOU from public/private organizations
 - iv. Should choose schools that have a proven history of success in working with community organizations

c. Marty offered the assistance of his organization throughout the process and offered to take the Committee members on a field trip to see a well-functioning community school

C. Janeece Docal, Principal, Powell Elementary School

- a. Janeece gave a brief presentation during which she highlighted the various ways in which Powell Elementary school is partnering with the community and serving the community
- Important factors to consider when selecting partners: Alignment with mission and goals, support of academics, integration with curriculum, sustainability, structure, measurable outcomes, and accountability

D. Irasema Salcido, CEO and Founder, Cesar Chavez Charter Public Charter Schools for Public Policy

- a. Irasema gave a brief presentation during which she highlighted the DC Promise Neighborhood Initiative
- b. She highlighted the importance of integrating the children and the parents into the process
- c. She also stressed the importance of incorporating data collection methods in the plan for the community school so that outcomes can be measured

E. Nancy Brenowitz Katz, Project Manager, OSSE

- a. Nancy discussed the RFA for the Community Schools Initiative Incentive and the timeline for awarding the grants
 - i. Nancy will send out the RFA in Word for committee to submit comments by April 16th
 - ii. Awards may be up to \$200,000 each and at least 5 awards will be given

F. Group Discussion

- Some committee members raised concern about their participation on the committee and whether schools/organizations that they are connected with would be allowed to apply for the grants
- b. In order to alleviate this concern, two solutions were agreed upon:
 - i. The RFA will be posted online for public comment
 - ii. Any Committee member who feels that he/she has a conflict of interest will not review applications for the grants
