

Alternate Assessment Eligibility Process Memo for the 2020-21 School Year

Introduction

OSSE is committed to providing equitable assessment opportunities for all students in the District of Columbia. Alternate districtwide assessments are available for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities as an alternative to participating in the general statewide assessments. While there is much that remains uncertain, we will continue planning for spring 2021 administration as we keep a close watch on public health conditions. We will share additional details directly with LEAs as information becomes available.

Applying for Alternate Assessment Eligibility in SEDS

Eligibility for participation in **any** alternate assessment for the 2020-2021 school year begins with LEAs completing the appropriate documentation in Special Education Data System (SEDS). During the Individualized Education Program (IEP) development process, or through an IEP amendment,) teams are to carefully review OSSE's <u>participation criteria</u> to identify individual students for whom it may be most appropriate to participate in the alternate assessment program.

Every fall, OSSE reviews student records to determine eligibility for alternate assessment participation for the current school year. For OSSE to review a student for alternate assessment eligibility for the 2020-21 school year, the following documentation must be made in SEDS:

- 1. There is a current IEP on file.
- 2. The current IEP indicates "Alternate Assessment" selected by the IEP team.
- 3. There is a "DC Alternate Assessment Participation Decision Documentation Form" on file that was completed and submitted with the current IEP.
- 4. All documentation to support the alternate assessment decision form has been uploaded.

Application Scenarios

For further guidance, please refer to the following scenarios.

Scenario 1: New Applicants

For new students requesting eligibility for alternate assessments in 2020-21, follow the process below:

- Ensure there is an IEP current in SEDS.
- Ensure the current IEP indicates "Alternate Assessment" selected by IEP team
 If the IEP does not indicate "alternate assessment," an IEP amendment is needed.
- Complete the "DC Alternate Assessment Participation Decision Documentation Form" (Participation Criteria Form) electronically in SEDS.
- Upload all supporting documentation in SEDS.

Scenario 2: Yearly Renewals for Alternate Assessment Eligibility

For students renewing eligibility for alternate assessments in 2020-21, please follow the steps listed below:

- Ensure there is an IEP current in SEDS.
- Ensure the current IEP indicates "Alternate Assessment" selected by IEP team.
 If the IEP does not indicate "alternate assessment," an IEP amendment is needed.
- Ensure the "DC Alternate Assessment Participation Decision Documentation Form" (Participation Criteria Form) is completed electronically in SEDS.
- Ensure all supporting documentation is in SEDS.
- NOTE* Students determined eligible for the 2019-20 school year will automatically be determined eligible for the 2020-21 school year with the aforementioned steps in place.

LEA Rolling View of Applications via Qlik

Starting on **Oct. 5. 2020**, LEA Assessment Managers, and LEA Special Education POCs will be granted access to the Qlik application. As a reminder, a completed application includes: (1) a "DC Alternate Assessment Participation Decision Documentation Form" (PDF or electronic); (2) "Alternate Assessment" selected in SEDS; and (3) a current IEP. In the Qlik application, LEAs and schools will be able to see which students have completed or not completed these steps in SEDS. In addition, LEAs and schools will be able to see if any intended applicants are missing entirely from the Qlik feed. If there are students missing, or any missing requirements, LEAs/schools are responsible for making corrections to the students' records in SEDS.

The Qlik feed will be updated daily. Please note that if you complete the electronic participation decision form in SEDS after October 16th, this record will not be reviewed until the appeals process and will be reflected in the Qlik feed starting November 23rd. OSSE Review of Applications for Alternate Assessment Eligibility

Starting on <u>Oct. 19, 2020.</u> OSSE will review all alternate assessment eligibility applications. Eligibility determinations will be returned to LEAs in SEDS. On <u>Nov. 23, 2020</u>, all determinations will be reflected in SEDS. LEAs will also be able to view the determinations in the Qlik application.

Determination Appeals

If an LEA decides to appeal an eligibility determination, then the LEA will do so through a Quickbase application. The Quickbase application will allow LEAs to communicate further with OSSE about the case via a secure platform. For most appeals, additional documentation that supports the IEP team's request will need to be uploaded in SEDS (e.g., new evaluations, case records, or assessment results). Access to this Quickbase application and detailed user instructions will be provided to LEAs by November 23rd.

 LEAs ensure or update documentation for alternate assessment requests in SEDS. For OSSE to review for participation eligibility, a student must have the following in SEDS for the 2020-21 school year: There is a current IEP on file. The current IEP indicates "Alternate Assessment" selected by the IEP team. There is a "DC Alternate Assessment Participation Decision Documentation Form" on file associated with the current IEP. All documentation to support the alternate assessment decision form has been uploaded. 	Oct. 16, 2020	SEDS

Final deadline for LEAs to submit their Exceeding 1 Percent Cap Justification Form to OSSE.	Nov. 6 2020	Quickbase
OSSE sends eligibility determinations to LEAs in SEDS. In addition, LEAs will be able to view these determinations in Qlik.	Nov. 23, 2020	SEDS Qlik
LEAs may appeal eligibility determinations in Quickbase and in most cases will need to submit additional evidence that supports the appeal to OSSE in SEDS. As a rare exception, LEAs may submit new eligibility applications after the application window for transfer	Nov. 23, 2020 – Dec. 18, 2020	Quickbase SEDS
