# Executive Summary

The Healthy Schools Act of 2010 (HSA or Act), DC Official Code § 38-821.01 *et seq.*, affirms the District of Columbia’s (District or DC) deep commitment to ensuring all students attend schools that support their health and well-being. The Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) is unapologetically dedicated to supporting the physical, mental, and social-emotional health of all students and staff in the District. A safe and welcoming environment is fundamental to educational success, and OSSE supports local education agencies (LEAs) and schools in implementing comprehensive programs designed to foster healthy, joyful learning spaces. This commitment is evident in our robust HSA initiatives, which include providing nutritious meals utilizing ingredients from local producers, encouraging the use of school gardens, supporting the implementation of environmental literacy programs, and promoting health and physical activity. This report includes biennial highlights for these programs for fiscal years 2023 and 2024 (i.e., the 2022-23 and 2023-24 school years).

Highlights in this report include the following:

- OSSE leveraged partnerships and secured three federal grants and awards to support and promote farm-to-school initiatives.
- Fourteen additional schools reported having a share table from the 2022-23 school year to the 2023-24 school year.
- OSSE maintained partnerships, provided training and evaluation opportunities (including cohosting the Regional School Garden Summit), and promoted annual celebrations to support schools with the development and maintenance of school gardens.
- OSSE coordinated the update of the Environmental Literacy Plan, released new public data visualization tools that display the extent of environmental literacy, outdoor learning, and partnerships with schools and community-based organizations (CBOs) in the District, and provided high quality training and technical assistance to schools and LEAs.
- OSSE released the nation’s first statewide Menstrual Health Education Standards, continued to monitor student achievement and school compliance with health and physical education requirements, and convened the Health and Physical Education Leadership Cadre (HPELC).
- In fiscal years 2023 and 2024, OSSE awarded Health Food Curriculum Grants totaling \$3.5 million to FRESHFARM Foodprints to support programming in 21 schools, benefitting 7,600 students from pre-K 3 to grade 5.

## Introduction

As DC’s state education agency, OSSE sets high standards, builds educator and system capacity to meet those standards, expands educational opportunities for all learners with a focus on traditionally underserved students, and holds everyone—including ourselves—accountable for results. OSSE works to ensure that District learners of all ages and backgrounds are equipped with the knowledge and skills needed to pursue and thrive on the life path of their choice. We know that healthy bodies are critical for academic success. OSSE’s Division of Health and Wellness (OSSE H&W) leverages programming, partnerships, policy, and data

to remove health barriers to learning so that people of all ages and backgrounds are prepared to succeed in school and in life. OSSE supports healthy environments for District of Columbia Public Schools (DCPS), public charter schools, and participating private schools for all students and school communities. The HSA requires that OSSE submit a biennial comprehensive report on the District's compliance with the Act to the Mayor, Council, and the Healthy Youth and Schools Commission.

The report is organized in six sections:

- I. An update on farm-to-school initiatives;
- II. A summary of share table participation;
- III. The state of school gardens;
- IV. The state of environmental education;
- V. School compliance with health and physical education requirements and student achievement with respect to health and physical education requirements; and
- VI. Information on HSA Grants.

Recommendations and plans for future improvement of the initiatives are included throughout each section of the report.

## I. Farm-to-School

[Farm-to-school](#) initiatives connect schools and local farms for the following objectives: (1) serving healthy meals in schools; (2) improving student nutrition; (3) providing agriculture, health, and nutrition education opportunities; and (4) supporting local and regional farmers. Farm-to-school initiatives establish relationships between local foods and students through various methods, including:

- Providing locally grown, locally processed, and unprocessed foods in school meals and as taste tests;
- Supporting educational activities related to agriculture, food, health, or nutrition, such as nutrition education curricula, farm tours, farmer in the classroom sessions, culinary education, educational sessions for parents and community members, and visits to farmers' markets; and
- Cultivating school gardens as an opportunity for hands-on learning.

OSSE has integrated locally grown foods into school meal programs since the adoption of the HSA. On average, public and public charter schools report procuring 1.5 million pounds of local food from a total of 158 growers in DC, Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and West Virginia. During the 2022-23 school year specifically, schools procured over 950,000 pounds of local items from over 60 producers at a value of over 1.4 million dollars.

The table below shows the local providers and growers from whom schools most frequently procured local items. The table also shows the top five local items procured for the 2022-23 school year and the first quarter of the 2023-24 school year.<sup>1</sup>

Throughout the 2023 and 2024 fiscal years, OSSE leveraged partnerships and pursued federal funding to support and promote farm-to-school initiatives.

## Partnerships

OSSE, in conjunction with governmental and nongovernmental partners, develops programs to promote the benefits of purchasing and eating locally grown and unprocessed foods from growers engaged in sustainable agricultural practices. In the 2022-23 and 2023-24 school years, OSSE maintained partnerships with the following District agencies and food system stakeholders.

OSSE continues to serve as a non-voting member in the DC Good Food Purchasing Program Coalition (the Coalition). The Coalition was founded in 2016 and is comprised of public, private, and non-profit groups dedicated to improving food purchasing across the District. The Coalition grew out of the [DOEE’s Sustainable DC Plan](#), which focuses on making the District the “healthiest, greenest, most livable city for all residents.”

## Annual Programs

OSSE encourages schools to participate in annual programs that promote the benefits of purchasing and eating locally grown, unprocessed foods from growers who use sustainable agriculture practices.

Berries & Greens Day: Schools participate in [Berries & Greens Day](#) each June to showcase locally grown produce in school meals. This event educates students about the health and environmental benefits of eating locally grown fruits and vegetables. It also teaches students how healthy eating leads to healthy educational outcomes.

Hear the Crunch: OSSE and schools celebrate [National Nutrition Month®](#) each March. Created by the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, National Nutrition Month® is a nutrition education and information campaign to emphasize the importance of making informed food choices and developing sound eating and physical activity habits. As part of the month-long celebration, OSSE and [DC Hunger Solutions](#) encourage schools to participate in a city-wide apple crunch to celebrate the benefits of school breakfast.

## Federal Grants and Awards

OSSE received the following federal grants and awards to support farm-to-school programming.

Farm-to-School Grant: In fiscal year 2022, OSSE was awarded a competitive Patrick Leahy [Farm-to-School Grant](#) from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). This grant provides \$157,059 to build staff capacity within OSSE H&W and hire a contractor to develop and execute a 10-year retrospective review and

create a new roadmap of the District’s state-level farm-to-school activities. OSSE released the solicitation for the contract in summer 2024.

The contractor will manage the retrospective and roadmap process and outcome evaluation of the farm-to-school program, and OSSE will use the evaluation findings to increase the amount of local food served in Child Nutrition Programs (CNPs).

Local Food for Schools Cooperative Agreement Program: In fiscal year 2023, OSSE [received](#) the USDA non-competitive [Local Foods for Schools Cooperative Agreement Program](#) award, providing \$422,500 from September 2022 through January 2025. In fiscal year 2024, OSSE is building program capacity and hiring a contractor to aggregate and distribute local foods to public and public charter schools from local farmers and producers, small businesses, and socially disadvantaged farmers and producers. The contractor will increase the number of pounds of local food available in 40 schools at a time when supply chain disruptions and transitioning back to normal meal operations limit schools’ ability to serve locally grown foods. This will increase economic opportunities for 23 local farmers and producers, 19 small businesses, and nine socially disadvantaged farmers and producers in the region.

This grant will improve the efficiency and impact of the procurement supply chain and increase the amount of fresh and local foods schools can procure and serve to students. It will improve the quality of school meals while supporting small businesses and socially disadvantaged farmers and producers.

Farm-to-School State Formula Grant: In December 2022, OSSE received a second USDA fiscal year 2023 non-competitive [Farm-to-School State Formula Grant award](#) providing \$647,244 from September 2022 through the end of fiscal year 2026. This grant supports state agency efforts to implement and expand farm-to-school activity among institutions participating in CNPs, build and increase the capacity of participating institutions to procure and use local food in program meals, and provide agricultural education opportunities for participating children. Planned activities include the following:



- Executing a contract for a community-based organization (CBO) to support school food authorities (SFAs) in implementing farm-to-school;
- Establishing a sub-grant to increase incentives for SFAs to serve local foods;
- Executing a contract for an evaluation of the incentive program;
- Increasing state agency resources for farm-to-school activities; and
- Creating a regional procurement summit to offer an opportunity for schools, CBOs, and advocates to deepen community connections, share best practices, and distribute resources, modeled after the School Program’s successful [Regional School Garden Summit](#).

**+** *Future Improvement—Training:* In the 2024-2025 and 2025-26 school years, OSSE plans to expand trainings with SFA directors, foodservice management companies, and food vendor representatives who manage school foodservice in the District. OSSE continues separate targeted annual training for school food vendors and plans to increase touch points throughout the school year.

## Cost of Food and Funding

SFAs operating CNPs in the District receive federal and local meal reimbursements to support meal site operations and food costs. These reimbursements are not intended to be a dollar-for-dollar match, and food prices have continued to rise even after the COVID-19 pandemic and other supply chain disruptions have eased. In the past few school years, SFAs have worked with their food vendors to address economic price adjustments and renegotiate meal prices for CNPs based on the [United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers \(CPI-U\)](#).

**+** *Future Improvement—Leveraging Federal Entitlement Dollars:* The HSA local meal incentive of five cents per meal for those that meet the locally grown and unprocessed requirement does not offset the current adjusted meal costs. To address the shortfall in support of local procurement, OSSE plans to leverage existing federal entitlement dollars in fiscal years 2025 and 2026. USDA allocates between four and six million dollars in entitlement funds for the District’s 65 SFAs. These funds support the administration of the National School Lunch Program and other reimbursable meal programs. These funds are distributed through specific vendors but can be leveraged to encourage these vendors—especially in the [USDA Department of Defense Fresh program](#)—to offer more local items to the District’s SFAs. Annual targeted technical assistance will continue to be provided to help SFAs utilize their full funding allocation and offset fresh produce foodservice expenses each school year.

## II. Share Tables

A “share table” is a place where students or staff can place unopened or sealed foods, such as fruit and milk, for others to take instead of throwing them away. During the 2022-23 school year, 68 schools reported having a share table. The number of schools increased to 82 in the 2023-24 school year (Attachment 1).

## III. School Gardens

OSSE envisions a future in which all District youth are engaged in high-quality garden-based learning in schools. OSSE provides technical assistance and training to schools and partner organizations to increase the number of students engaged in high-quality school garden programs. As indicated in the tables below, there was an increase in the number of campuses with school gardens from the 2022-23 school year to the 2023-

24 school year. There was also an increase in the number of students, faculty, and staff engaged in garden-based teaching and learning from the 2022-23 school year to the 2023-24 school year. A list of all school campuses with school gardens is included in Attachment 2.

OSSE maintains partnerships, provides training and evaluation opportunities, and promotes annual celebrations to support schools with the development and maintenance of school gardens.

**+** *Future Improvement—Increase Accessibility of School Garden Information:* OSSE plans to continue to improve access to high-quality information for school garden programs, specifically for teachers and CBOs. For example, OSSE is updating resources, such as the [School Garden Guide](#), and maintaining productive peer-to-peer dialogue through the online [Sprout it Out forum](#).



## Trainings

Regional School Garden Summit: City Blossoms, the US Botanic Garden, and OSSE collaborated to develop and host the [2023 Regional Garden-based Learning Summit](#) on July 27-28, 2023. The Summit brought together 54 garden-based learning professionals from 34 CBOs in DC, Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania, and Virginia.

The Summit offered organizations an opportunity to strengthen community ties, share resources and best practices, and be inspired by the incredible work happening in the National Capital Region. The goal of the Summit was to equip participants with essential skills and information to enhance garden-based learning opportunities for children and youth in their communities. Following the Summit, attendees shared that they felt more connected with a network of garden-based learning colleagues in the Mid-Atlantic region; reported having more ideas, resources, and solutions they could apply in their work; stated that the summit increased their awareness of other garden-based learning programs in the region; and felt inspired by the work happening in the region.

Following the Summit, OSSE, City Blossoms, and the US Botanic Garden developed a Regional School Garden Summit Toolkit to support future DC summits as well as summits put on in other regions of the country. This toolkit will improve the efficacy of future planning and engagement efforts.

Outdoor Learning Gatherings: OSSE hosted nine gatherings during the 2022-23 school year and seven gatherings during the 2023-24 school year. [Outdoor Learning Gatherings](#) offer educators the opportunity to connect with peers interested in engaging students in outdoor learning. Participants receive resources and learn best practices that they can incorporate into their teaching practice.



**+** *Future Improvement—Expand Outdoor Learning Gathering Participation*: During the 2023-24 school year, the average attendance at gatherings was eight participants. OSSE will implement a new communications plan that includes enhanced outreach efforts, webpage updates to include a more streamlined registration process, and improved targeted outreach that leverages partners to promote the gatherings.

Summer Institute for Garden-Based Teaching: In partnership with the Friends of the National Arboretum, OSSE implemented the Summer Institute for Garden-Based Teaching in 2022, 2023, and 2024 to increase the use of school gardens and outdoor learning spaces among classroom teachers and school staff. The institute took place over four days in July, with the majority of sessions taking place at the Washington Youth Garden. There were 31 participants in 2022, 28 participants in 2023, and 35 participants in 2024.

**+** *Future Improvement—Broaden the Depth and Breadth of Support*: OSSE plans to collaborate with LEAs, other District agencies, and CBOs to make data-informed decisions to continue to broaden the depth and breadth of supports provided to school garden programs. OSSE plans to work with partners to provide

support to schools that are interested in establishing a new school garden and to schools that previously had a school garden that recently became inactive.


## Evaluation

In 2024, OSSE established a data sharing agreement with the University of Texas at Austin to access evaluation data on school gardens in the District. These data, gathered using the research-based National School Garden Sustainability Survey, will help OSSE determine the types of supports needed to improve the quality of school gardens.<sup>5</sup> This survey will be administered annually.

Seventy-three schools completed the Sustainability Survey, enabling OSSE to identify gaps and strengths of their garden programs, including for the first time how many school gardens are “thriving.” Of those 73 schools, four (DC Bilingual Public Charter School, Payne Elementary School, School Without Walls at Francis Stevens, and Seaton Elementary School) met the criteria to be classified as “thriving.” The two biggest barriers to schools using their school garden are time constraints and lack of funding. OSSE will conduct additional research to better understand these constraints and to learn how OSSE can support school garden programs to mitigate these barriers.

## Growing Healthy Schools Month

[Growing Healthy Schools Month](#), an annual celebration led by OSSE, highlights how schools are creating healthy environments for students. The event emphasizes mental health and wellbeing, nutrition, outdoor learning and environmental literacy, and physical education. In the 2022-23 school year, seven schools participated, while in the 2023-24 school year 42 schools participated.

 *Future Improvement—Expand School Participation in Growing Healthy Schools Month:* There is potential to increase the number of schools participating in the celebration and to enhance the quality of offered supports. This can be achieved by collaborating with external partners and promoting the event across government agencies as a District-wide initiative. Additionally, this event can further highlight the efforts of schools to create healthy environments for students. With support from [FoodCorps](#), OSSE created a [Growing Healthy Schools Month Storymap](#) and is exploring ways to promote the resource to the broader community in the future.

## IV. Environmental Literacy

The [Environmental Literacy Program](#) assists schools in the implementation of the DC Environmental Literacy Plan (ELP) by providing environmental education guidance, training, and technical assistance. Throughout fiscal years 2023 and 2024, OSSE coordinated the updating of the ELP, released new data visualization tools, and provided high quality training and technical assistance to schools and LEAs.

### 2023 Update to the Environmental Literacy Plan

In February and March 2023, OSSE met with community members to discuss the progress of the 2020 ELP and to gather suggestions for the 2023 ELP update. OSSE also established a workgroup from the Environmental Literacy Advisory Committee to update the plan. The workgroup reviewed all objectives, strategies, and action items from the 2020 ELP. Most elements remain unchanged, reflecting a continued commitment to the plan’s ongoing strategies. The [2024 ELP Implementation Table](#) provides a detailed description of agency activities to support progress on all action items.

**+** *Future Improvement—2024 ELP Activities:* OSSE H&W plans to collaborate with other divisions in OSSE on emerging initiatives that support ELP activities. These initiatives include the following:

- Utilizing data from OSSE’s District-wide [course data collection project](#), which collects information about courses offered by all LEAs in the District—including section- and student-level course information, teachers, instructional time, and student enrollment—to track schools offering courses that support environmental literacy and student enrollment in these classes (see [2024 ELP Implementation Table](#) Strategy ST1.a).
- Creating new curricular resources, such as a crosswalk document that highlights Early Learning Standards that include environmental literacy concepts and supports for social studies standards (see [2024 ELP Implementation Table](#) Strategy ED1.a). Additionally, OSSE anticipates publishing updated CTE Career Ready Standards and Health Education Standards in the coming months, which will provide new opportunities for further integration and alignment of environmental literacy supports (see [2024 ELP Implementation Table](#) Strategy ED1.b).
- Collaborating with the OSSE Division of Data, Assessment, and Research to determine the best methods to evaluate changes in student and teacher environmental literacy and establish metrics to track improvement (see [2024 ELP Implementation Table](#) Strategy ST3.a).

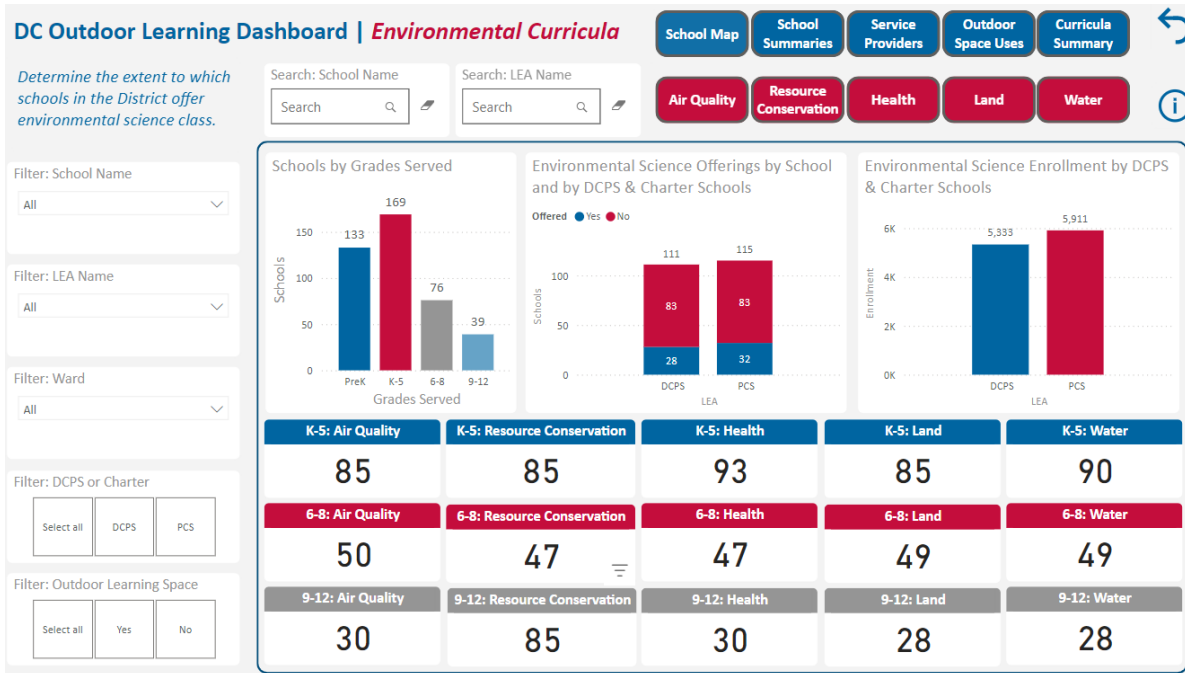


- Identifying barriers to the implementation of environmental education programming at schools that report little to no participation in the [School Health Profile](#) (see [2024 ELP Implementation Table Strategy DA1.b](#)).<sup>6</sup>

## Environmental Education Initiatives: Data Collection

Since 2022, the School Health Profile has included an “Environment” section to collect environmental literacy implementation data. In 2023, OSSE released two online tools to determine the extent of environmental education initiatives taking place in public and public charter schools. These tools use data collected via the [School Health Profile](#), environmental education provider survey and interviews, and other publicly available data sources.

The [Outdoor Learning ArcGIS map](#) provides a visual representation of the geographic spread and location of schools with outdoor learning, community partners, and outdoor learning features. The Outdoor Learning Dashboard creates data visualizations of the extent of environmental literacy, outdoor learning, and partnerships with schools and CBOs (see image). As of the publishing of this report, the Outdoor Learning Dashboard is available to District government employees, with plans to make it available to the public in the near future.

## Training and Technical Assistance

Training for Early Childhood Educators: In fiscal year 2023, OSSE H&W collaborated with OSSE's Division of Early Learning, as well as community partners, to host multiple environmentally focused early learning trainings for early childhood educators. Several organizations co-hosted nine webinars on how to integrate environmental themes in early learning contexts. An average of 50 early childhood educators attended each session.

Capital LEAF and Green Ribbon Schools: In January 2020, OSSE launched [Capital LEAF](#) (Leaders in Environmental Actions for our Future), a recognition program for green, healthy, sustainable District schools. This initiative acknowledges schools' efforts to increase sustainability and environmental education efforts and empower youth to take actions that will reduce environmental impact and improve the health and wellness of their school and community. As of 2024, all five schools that completed the Capital LEAF pilot program have been recognized as [US Department of Education Green Ribbon Schools](#) (Cardozo Education Campus, Marie Reed Elementary School, Whittier Elementary School, DC Bilingual Public Charter School, and Key Elementary School). OSSE plans to use Capital LEAF tools to help schools who have participated in the Environmental Literacy Leadership Cadre document their environmental efforts and successes and to support more schools with receiving the national Green Ribbon Schools recognition.


## Environmental Literacy Leadership Cadre


Educators from 12 schools participated in cohort four of the Environmental Literacy Leadership Cadre, which met from February 2022 through May 2023. Educators worked to integrate environmental literacy across all grade levels through experiences such as school garden explorations, energy audits, and environmental literacy days. Descriptions of efforts at all schools are captured in [school snapshots](#). To ensure that OSSE's environmental literacy supports remain relevant to schools and meaningful to learners, OSSE will review the agency's technical assistance offerings for future improvements. This reevaluation will allow for the development of long-term impact strategy to effectively integrate and align environmental literacy across school programs, practices, and curricula.

## V. Health Education, Physical Education, and Physical Activity

OSSE provides individuals with the necessary resources to create healthy environments in academic settings, including high-quality health and physical education programs. In fiscal years 2023 and 2024, OSSE released the nation's first statewide [Menstrual Health Education Standards](#), continued to monitor student achievement and school compliance with health and physical education requirements, and convened the Health and Physical Education Leadership Cadre (HPELC).

The [Society for Health and Physical Educators \(SHAPE\) America](#) has released revised 2024 national health and physical education standards. In 2024, OSSE will begin the process of reviewing, updating, and, in consultation with the SBOE, releasing the revised [DC Health Education Standards and DC Physical Education Standards](#).

 *Future Improvement—Strategic Realignment of Health and Physical Education Supports:* As discussed throughout this section, the revised standards will inform a realignment of educator- and school-level technical assistance and student assessment. OSSE will provide implementation tools, resources, and trainings to assist LEA leaders, school leaders, and educators in planning and implementing the revised standards. Adoption of the standards is anticipated in spring 2025, with implementation beginning in the 2025-26 school year.

 *Future Improvement—High School Graduation Requirements:* OSSE H&W is actively engaged in OSSE’s initiative [Reimagining High School Graduation Requirements](#) in the District. This effort aims to establish new high school graduation requirements, including the creation of a District-wide Graduate Profile. This profile will outline the academic, personal, and interpersonal competencies that high school students should achieve before graduation. By contributing actively, OSSE H&W’s aims to elevate the visibility and importance of health education and physical education in preparing students to lead healthy lives.

## Health Education and Physical Education Standards

Menstrual Health Education Standards: In fiscal year 2023, OSSE, in consultation with the State Board of Education (SBOE), developed the nation’s first statewide [Menstrual Health Education Standards](#), as required by the [Expanding Student Access to Period Products Act of 2022](#). These standards, an addendum to the [DC Health Education Standards](#), offer a clear, skill-based, and age-appropriate approach to menstrual health education starting in grade 4. Implementation of the menstrual health education standards began in the 2023-24 school year for all public and public charter schools. OSSE commits to maintaining this important health topic in the District’s updated health education standards anticipated in 2025.

## Health and Physical Education Requirements

Data from the School Health Profiles indicate ongoing challenges for schools in meeting the HSA’s health and physical education minute requirements.<sup>7</sup> Approximately 50 percent of schools met the physical education minute requirements for grades K–5 and grades 6–8, and approximately 50 percent of schools met the health education minute requirement in grades 6–8. However, less than 30 percent of schools met the health education minute requirement in grades K–5. Key reasons for non-compliance include challenges with staffing, scheduling and school facilities/grounds. Attachment 3 provides detailed information on individual schools’ compliance with these requirements.

OSSE uses these data to provide technical assistance to LEAs and schools on meeting the minutes requirements while delivering high-quality health education, physical education, and physical activity programs. Schools failing to meet [HSA minutes requirements](#) must submit a [Self-Assessment and Action Plan \(SAAP\)](#) outlining strategies to achieve compliance. In the 2021-22 school year, only seven percent of required schools submitted a SAAP, increasing to 53 percent in school year 2022-23. Despite the improvement, schools continue to face challenges in developing actionable strategies, often due to funding constraints related to space and staffing. To address these challenges, OSSE will continue to engage LEA and school leaders on improving their compliance by providing training webinars, technical assistance office hours, and actionable resources to address the top barriers identified in past SAAP cycles.

## Health and Physical Education Assessment

As indicated in the table below, during the 2022-23 school year, 190 public and public charter schools representing 50 LEAs participated in the Health and Physical Education Assessment (HPEA), an increase in participation over the 2021-22 school year.

The data in the table below show assessment results from 12,216 students across grade 5, grade 8, and high school who completed the 2022-23 HPEA. Attachment 4 lists schools with participation rates under 10 percent. Overall, for the 2022-23 assessment, performance was strongest among students in grade 5,

particularly in the Human Body & Personal Health and Mental & Emotional Health domains. Grade 8 students showed strongest performance in the Mental & Emotional Health and Alcohol, Tobacco, & Other Drugs domains. High school students excelled most in the Mental & Emotional Health and Nutrition sections.

*Future Improvement—Reevaluate the Health and Physical Education Assessment:* The HPEA was first administered during the 2015-16 school year to measure student achievement with respect to health and physical education standards.<sup>8</sup> The assessment tool is now due for review. LEAs have provided feedback highlighting issues such as scheduling disruptions, testing burden among students and educators, and an overall concern that the assessment does not adequately support school-level improvements aligned with health and physical education.

In response, OSSE decided to pause the administration of the HPEA beginning in the 2023-24 school year. This pause will enable OSSE to conduct a thorough evaluation of the assessment, engage stakeholders and align the portfolio to the upcoming revised health and physical education standards.

## Health and Physical Education Leadership Cadre

The HPELC is a community of health education and physical education teachers committed to enhancing high-quality health and physical education for students. Members collaborate to share best practices, engage in peer learning opportunities, and develop skills in health and physical education instruction. They also participate in discussions aimed at improving comprehensive health and physical education in schools.

In 2024, OSSE reconvened the HPELC following a programmatic pause during the COVID-19 pandemic. From March 2024 to June 2025, the group will focus on refining professional practice for health and physical education teachers and implementing strategies to advance the District’s health education and physical education standards. The HPELC comprises four members from DCPS, Capital City PCS, Early Childhood

Academy PCS, and Thurgood Marshall Academy PCS along with three mentors representing DCPS and Center City PCS, selected for their demonstrated leadership in health and physical education in public and public charter schools. The three mentors serve as advisors to OSSE and conduct peer-to-peer mentorship, leadership and collaboration.

## VI. Healthy Schools Act Grants

OSSE utilizes local funds to administer two key grants: the Healthy Food Curriculum Grant and the Healthy Schools Grant, which support schools and CBOs with various programs aligned with HSA goals.

### Healthy Food Curriculum Grant

In fiscal years 2023 and 2024, OSSE awarded the Healthy Food Curriculum Grant to FRESHFARM FoodPrints. See Attachment 5 for the list of partner schools.

In fiscal year 2023, FRESHFARM FoodPrints received 1.6 million dollars to implement programming in 21 schools. Across these schools, the grantee provided 3,360 hours of instruction (2,650 individual classes) and reached 7,000 pre-K 3 through grade 5 students.

In fiscal year 2024, FRESHFARM FoodPrints received 1.9 million dollars to implement programming in the same 21 schools. Across these schools, the grantee provided 3,557 hours of instruction (2,612 individual classes) and reached 7,600 pre-K 3 through grade 5 students.


Through these grant funds, school gardens at all 21 supported schools were improved, with additions including new growing space, refurbished beds, healthy soil, mulching, and/or new plants. Students grew and harvested more than 30 crops from their school gardens, including lettuce, spinach, kale, cucumbers, tomatoes, peppers, carrots, beets, sweet potatoes, winter squash, and radishes.

### Healthy Schools Grant

The Healthy Schools Grant Program was created to increase the capacity of public and public charter schools to support the implementation of health education, physical education, physical activity, nutrition education, environmental education, garden-based education, and farm-to-school programs. The Healthy Schools Grant Program consolidates previous OSSE competitive grants related to healthy schools under a unified initiative aligned with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) [Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child \(WSCC\) model](#).

In fiscal year 2024, four CBOs were awarded funding to support programming in 22 schools. Attachment 6 provides the list of schools receiving programming from these CBOs.

- [City Blossoms](#) partnered with six schools to build new school gardens, support existing school gardens, and incorporate garden-based programming into their curricula.
- [Dance Institute of Washington](#) implemented afterschool dance training and education, coupled with nutrition education, dance injury prevention, physical and mental health workshops, mentoring/emotional support counseling, and youth voice-centering activities in five schools.
- [Friends of the National Arboretum](#) delivered the Educator Coaching Program, providing co-teaching opportunities, technical assistance, educator training, connection to low-cost/free DC garden supply networks, and introductions to garden-adjacent partners to meet other specific school-identified needs to nine partner schools.
- [Grassroots Health](#) implemented health education programming (on the topics of sexual health, healthy eating, and mental health) using trained National Collegiate Athletics Association athletes as volunteer health educators and role models in five schools.

 *Future Improvement—Shift Health and Wellness Grants Strategy:* To leverage competitive grant funds for maximum impact and sustainability, OSSE H&W plans to integrate and streamline multiple competitive grants. The new model of grant-making will be implemented consistent with the following:

- Making grant supports available to CBOs who partner with early childhood facilities and/or public and public charter schools;
- Integrating OSSE H&W grants using the division’s two foundational approaches, the WSCC model and a multi-tiered system of support for technical assistance;
- Re-focusing grant requirements on building capacity and sustainability within the partner school or early childhood facility to sustain the work post-grant award; and
- Leveraging data to identify need and determine eligible early childhood facility and school partners to work with the CBOs.

This transition will span two fiscal years, allowing OSSE to build the new model strategically, engage stakeholders, conduct outreach to build applicant interest and capacity, and build the necessary internal systems to support the initiatives’ success.
