



Allowable Uses of Funds

Title 1, Part D: Neglected, Delinquent, and At-Risk Programs

The purpose of Title I, Part D (Title I-D) funds is to provide supplementary programs and services to support education continuity for neglected or delinquent children and youth in locally operated residential facilities. All activities funded with Title I-D must be supplemental to activities that would not normally be provided at the facility in the absence of these funds.

Allowable Expenses	
Category	Examples
Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Teachers or teaching assistants for supplemental instruction• Tutors• Guidance counselors• Social workers• Career and technical education instructors• Transition coordinator and transition staff• Data management staff• Program coordinator
Instructional / Classroom supplies and materials	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Curriculum• Educational technology (i.e., Chromebooks, laptops, software)• Assessments for progress monitoring• Classroom libraries• Minor classroom setting remodeling, which can include paint, carpeting, dividers
Ongoing, sustained professional development	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Stipends for staff to attend professional development (PD)• Educational consultants• Materials/supplies necessary for PD• Conference registration and travel costs

Allowable Expenses	
Category	Examples
Transition services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Transition coordinator or transition staff • Software or other tools that assist with facilitating student transitions • Services needed to ensure a successful transition of a student into, through and from the facility to further education or employment • Partnerships with employers to create programs for successful transition to postsecondary education and employment • Career and technical educational instruction • Mentoring • College/career counseling • GED preparation
Family engagement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cost for engagement activities including materials and light refreshments • Transportation for family members
Health and social services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drug and alcohol counseling • Mental health services
Other	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After school and summer programs (non-credit-bearing).

Unallowable Expenses
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teachers providing core instruction
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Required textbooks or core curriculum materials
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Special education services included in a student’s individualized education program (IEP)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clerical position focused operational duties
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff recruitment costs
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Security equipment or software
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Equipment required for daily operation of the facility
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Building maintenance or repairs
