Introduction

The Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) grants an educator preparation provider (EPP) state approval after examining the quality of the provider and programs preparing teachers, service providers and administrators for District of Columbia pre-K through grade 12 schools; and determining that the subject area programs (SAPs) meet national or state standards for preparing candidates to enter the profession. State approval is required for EPPs in the District of Columbia offering professional preparation programs that prepare candidates who are eligible to earn an educator credential in the District of Columbia.

The state EPP and SAP approval system is designed to ensure that candidates and program completers of EPPs and SAPs who seek an educator credential in the District of Columbia receive the training and practicum experiences to enable them to provide effective and high-quality education to District of Columbia Public Schools students.

This directory is a comprehensive list of all EPPs that are approved by OSSE to recommend candidates for District of Columbia educator credentials. This EPP directory shows only the subject area programs that lead to eligibility for an OSSE educator credential. Please see each EPP's website for information on **all** education degrees and SAPs it offers.

OSSE Higher Education Licensure Commission Approval
