

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VR Process

First

 Complete a referral and submit it to the RSA Intake Team at 202-442-8400 or RSA.Intake@dc.gov

Second

 An Intake Staff Member will call you within two business days with your scheduled appointment for an Intake.

Third

 Go to your scheduled appointment and sign / complete all Intake Documents with your assigned worker.

Fourth

 Within two business days of your Intake Appointment, your VR Counselor will be assigned and you will work to complete eligibility with your counselor within 60 days.

Fifth

 After you are determined eligible for services, you with work with your counselor to develop your Individualized Plan for Employment (IPE) within 90 days.

Client's Role in the Vocational Rehabilitation Process

Provide or work with his or her VR counselor with all necessary documentation to advance through the VR process

Be an active participant in his or her VR case

Keep all scheduled appointments with his or her VR counselor, and be sure to call in a timely manner to reschedule, in the event an appointment cannot be kept

Keep in touch with his or her VR counselor

Follow the plan outlined in his or her Individualized Plan for Employment

Get to work!

Remain in contact with his or her VR counselor until successful exit from RSA
