Final deadline for LEAs updating alternate assessment eligibility documentation in the Special Programs database for the 2023-24 school year. *LEAs should begin this process as soon as school opens*	Nov. 13, 2023	Special Programs Database
OSSE sends eligibility determinations to LEAs in the Special Programs database.	Ongoing through Dec. 1, 2023	Special Programs Database
LEAs may appeal eligibility determinations in MSAA Quickbase and in most cases will need to submit additional evidence that supports the appeal to OSSE in the Special Programs database.	Dec. 1-19, 2023	MSAA QuickBase Special Programs Database
LEAs receive final eligibility determinations from OSSE in the Special Programs database.	Jan. 12, 2024	Quickbase

Test Security Training Requirements

- Individuals in the following roles must complete OSSE Test Security Training for 2023-24:
 - LEA Assessment Manager
 - LEA ACCESS for ELLs Test Coordinator
 - LEA MSAA/DLM Test Coordinator
 - LEA DC CAPE Test Coordinator
 - Nonpublic School Test Coordinator
- Training options will include webinars and asynchronous modules. All sessions will be the same. The next Test Security Training will be on February 2 from 1-4 pm.
- All individuals must pass the OSSE Test Security Training quiz with a score of at least 80 percent or higher.
 - The recorded training, Powerpoint, and quiz are available on the <u>Test Security webpage</u>.
- LEA Assessment Managers are responsible for ensuring that all authorized personnel at schools under their LEA are trained in test security policies and procedures.



School Test Security Plan

- OSSE requires **every school, including nonpublic schools,** that will administer a statewide assessment to complete and submit a School Test Security Plan prior to the start of the school's testing window.
- The School Test Security Plan serves as an official communication with OSSE of a school's plan for administering statewide assessments.
- The OSSE Assessment Portal application, through which School Test Security Plans are submitted, is now live.
- School plans must be submitted to OSSE for final approval at least 15 business days prior to the first day of testing.
 - Start and end dates for ACCESS for ELLs were due no later than Jan. 23, 2024.
 - Start and end dates for MSAA and DLM are due no later than Feb. 12, 2024.
 - Start and end dates for DC CAPE are due no later than Mar. 4, 2024.

ACCESS for ELLs Activities

ACCESS for ELLs and WIDA Alternate ACCESS

- Test window: Feb. 12 March 22
- Students are now loaded into WIDA AMS. LEAs should log in and verify student registrations and accommodations
- Materials will arrive in schools by Feb. 6
 - Upon receipt, inventory materials and store securely until administration
- Additional Materials order window opens Feb. 6
 - Orders must be placed by LEA test coordinator and shipped to individual schools
- Reference the OSSE <u>ACCESS Readiness Guide</u> for high-level activities to prepare for administration



2023-24 ACCESS Training Requirements

- WIDA has made substantial changes to three ACCESS training courses
 - Online ACCESS for ELLs: Administration
 - Paper ACCESS for ELLs: Administration
 - Alternate ACCESS: Administration and Scoring
- OSSE requires that all ACCESS Test Coordinators and Test Administrators recertify for applicable assessments in the 2023-24 school year, which includes passing the Certification Quiz with a score of 80 percent or higher
 - Recertification date must be on or after Sept. 1, 2023 for the courses listed above
- Kindergarten ACCESS recertification:
 - Required for Test Administrators
 - Recommended for Test Coordinators

MSAA and **DLM** Updates

DLM Registration and Overview of Tasks

- OSSE will begin enrolling eligible DLM students in grade 5 and grade 8 the week of Jan 15.
 - LEAs and nonpublic schools are responsible for enrolling eligible high school students for the DLM assessment.
- Key dates and additional process details are shared below:

Jan. 15 – Feb. 2	DLM LEA Test Coordinators add/update accounts for users in their LEA in Kite Educator Portal	
Jan. 25	DLM Test Administrator Training – Session 1 (virtual Teams meeting)	
Feb. 5 – Feb. 16	OSSE rosters grade 5 and grade 8 eligible students; LEAs and nonpublic schools' roster eligible high school students	
Feb. 16	DLM Test Administrator Training – Session 2 (virtual Team meeting)	
Feb. 19 – March	Test Administrators complete First Contact Survey and Personal Needs and Preferences (PNP) prior to testing *Reminder – student First Contact Survey and PNP must be completed at least one day prior to the start of testing. Testlet creation takes 24 hours upon completion.

Reminder: DLM Required Test Administrator Training

New for 2023-24: Educators with the Teacher role will need to access the DLM Required Test Administrator Training in the training section of <u>Kite Educator Portal</u> for the 2023-24 school year.

- Users who have a Kite account and the "Teacher" role assigned will be automatically enrolled in the training and can access the training via the training tab.
 - Newly created accounts will be enrolled in the training within about 30 minutes after their accounts are activated.
- New Test Administrators are still expected to pass each of the four modules with a score of 80 percent or higher.
 - Returning Test Administrators are still expected to pass one module with a score of 80 percent or higher.

MSAA Updates

- Students who are eligible for MSAA will be registered by OSSE
- The MSAA System will open to LEAs in late February
 - View student registrations
 - Add test administrators as needed
 - Review Test Administration Manual
 - Complete required training modules



DC CAPE Updates

DC CAPE Updates

- The ADAM platform is open to LEA Assessment Managers as of Friday, Jan. 19. LEA test coordinator accounts were created only for individuals listed as the LEA Assessment Manager in AllStaff.
- Nonpublic school test coordinators should also update their designations to LEA
 Assessment Manager in the Nonpublic AllStaff collection. Reach out to
 OSSE.callcenter@dc.gov for assistance with this process.
- We anticipate releasing the DC CAPE Accessibility Features & Accommodations (AF&A)
 Manual and Test Coordinator and Test Administrator Manuals in early February. These
 documents will be posted on the Pearson Support Portal.
- Pearson is developing reference guides to support specific tasks/processes LEAs will need to complete in ADAM.
