

2023-24 Statewide Assessment Policy Documents



2023-24 Required Statewide Assessments

In spring 2024, DC will administer the following required statewide assessments:

- DC CAPE
 - English language arts/literacy (ELA): Grades 3-8, ELA I and ELA II
 - Mathematics: Grades 3-8, Algebra I and Geometry
 - Students who took Geometry in middle school will take Algebra II in high school as their required assessment
 - Science: Grades 5, 8 and Biology
- MSAA ELA and mathematics: Grades 3-8, 11
- DLM Science: Grades 5, 8 and Biology
- ACCESS for ELLs and Alternate ACCESS: K-12
- NAEP Reading and Mathematics: Grades 4, 8 and 12 in selected schools
- NAEP Science: Grade 8 in selected schools



2023-24 Policy Documents Now Available

- 2023-24 Statewide Assessments Participation and Performance Policy
- 2023-24 Testing Accommodations Guide (TAG)
 - The TAG is updated annually and provides a crosswalk between accessibility features and accommodations that may appear in documentation, such as an IEP, 504 plan, or EL plan, and how these features may appear in vendor assessment management platforms.
- 2023-24 Test Security Guidelines
 - The Test Security Guidelines contain key policies updated annually. Overall, policies in the Test Security Guidelines for the 2023-24 school year are consistent with policies from the 2022-23 school year.





2023-24 ACCESS Pre-ID Timeline & Resources

- ACCESS Pre-ID window is open Nov. 10 –
 Dec. 13
 - LEAs confirm ACCESS registered students and indicate accommodations
 - See NGA Bulletin for more details
- LEAs can upload templates into the Quickbase application through Dec. 6
- Manual updates can be made in the Quickbase application through Dec. 13

- Pre-ID Assessment Quickbase application
 - View LEA roster of students
 - Download template to complete student assessment details and accommodations
- WIDA Accessibility and Accommodations Manual
 - Explanation of available accommodations
 - Use of Extended testing of a test domain over multiple days (EM) accommodation requires prior approval from OSSE.

- Bookings: ACCESS Support



2023-24 ACCESS Training Requirements

- WIDA has made substantial changes to three ACCESS training courses
 - Online ACCESS for ELLs: Administration
 - Paper ACCESS for ELLs: Administration
 - Alternate ACCESS: Administration and Scoring
- OSSE requires that all ACCESS Test Coordinators and Test Administrators recertify for applicable assessments in 2023-24, which includes passing the Certification Quiz with a score of 80% or higher
 - Recertification date must be on or after Sept. 1, 2023 for the courses listed above
- Kindergarten ACCESS recertification:
 - Required for Test Administrators
 - Recommended for Test Coordinators

2023-24 Alternate Assessment Processes and Updates



Alternate Assessment Eligibility

- Annually, students with the most significant cognitive disabilities who are determined eligible by OSSE for alternate assessment participation will take:
 - Multi-State Alternate Assessment (MSAA) in grades 3-8 and grade 11
 - Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) science alternate assessment in grades 5, 8 and high school biology
 - WIDA Alternate ACCESS in grades K-12
- Information on the alternate assessment eligibility process is on OSSE's website at <u>osse.dc.gov/service/participation-criteria-and-forms-alternate-districtwide-assessments</u>



Alternate Assessment Eligibility Process: How do I apply?

For OSSE to review a student for alternate assessment eligibility for the 2023-24 school year, the following documentation must be made available in the **Special Programs Database**:

- There is an active individualized education program (IEP) on file that indicates "Alternate Assessment" selected by the IEP team
- There is a current, fully completed 2023-24 "DC Alternate Assessment Participation Decision Documentation Form" electronically in the Special Programs database. This form is embedded in the Special Programs database as the Statewide Alternate Assessment Participation Criteria form <u>and</u> must be dated within the last (3) calendar years.
- All sources of supporting evidence for the alternate assessment decision form must be uploaded into the Special Programs database <u>and</u> dated within the last (3) calendar years.


MSAA and **DLM** Updates



MSAA and **DLM** Readiness Guides

New for 2023-24: OSSE has developed a 2-page MSAA and DLM Readiness Guide with high-level activities for each month

- Created in response to stakeholder feedback
- Will be shared in NGA bulletin and posted on OSSE website in December



Registration for eligible students in grades 3-8 will be completed by OSSE and should be verified/adjusted by LEAs. High school registration should be completed in <u>Kite Educator Portal</u> by the LEA. Student registration should align to the 2023-24 OSSE Statewide Assessments Participation and

LEA/school Coordinators and Test Administrators should attend the OSSE DLM Test Coordinator training and/or OSSE DLM Test Administrator Training. Training details and registration links can be found on the

DLM Required Test Administrator Training

New for 2023-24: Educators with the Teacher role will need to access the DLM Required Test Administrator Training in the training section of <u>Kite Educator Portal</u> for the 2023-2024 school year.

- Users who have a Kite account and the "Teacher" role assigned will be automatically enrolled in the training and can access the training via the training tab.
 - Newly created accounts will be enrolled in the training within about 30 minutes after their accounts are activated.
- New Test Administrators are still expected to pass each of the four modules with a score of 80% or higher.
 - Returning Test Administrators are still expected to pass one module with a score of 80% or higher.

Test Security Training Requirements

- Individuals in the following roles must complete OSSE Test Security Training for 2023-24:
 - LEA Assessment Manager
 - LEA ACCESS for ELLs Test Coordinator
 - LEA MSAA/DLM Test Coordinator
 - LEA DC CAPE Test Coordinator
 - Nonpublic School Test Coordinator
- Training options will include live options (in-person or webinar) and asynchronous modules
- All individuals must pass the OSSE Test Security Training quiz with a score of at least 80 percent or higher.
- LEA Assessment Managers are responsible for ensuring that all authorized personnel at schools under their LEA are trained in test security policies and procedures.



Test Security Training Timelines

- OSSE anticipates releasing the asynchronous training via the OSSE Learning Management System (LMS) in late November or early December
- Live trainings will take place beginning in December
- LEA Assessment Managers and LEA Test Coordinators must complete OSSE test security training and pass the quiz before submitting school test security plans for spring 2024
