The Office of the State Superintendent of Education, Adult and Family Education (OSSE AFE), in partnership with the University of the District of Columbia (UDC), is hosting a Mini-Professional Development Institute for adult education providers, training providers, workforce development providers, partner agencies and other stakeholders from Monday, May 22 to Wednesday, May 24, 2023. There are two, 1-hour sessions scheduled on each day, at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Please note that session 4, *Individualize Skill Building with IXL Learning*, is scheduled for 90 minutes. All sessions will be hosted online.

This mini-professional development (PD) institute will provide a foundation of evidence-based strategies and tools that educators, trainers, and workforce providers can utilize to help District residents achieve their academic, professional, and personal goals as they progress on their learning and/or career paths. Participants will gain strategies that can be put into practice to support District residents as they work to strengthen their literacy, numeracy, and digital skills to obtain, advance and/or transition to fulfilling careers in high-demand industries with family-sustaining wages.

The O*NET standards were developed to align employers, trainers, and job seekers through the language of skills. In this session, learn the logic and structure of the O*NET content model to more easily navigate O*NET OnLine. By the end of this session, you will feel confident browsing O*NET OnLine and guiding students on My Next Move (o Mi Próximo Paso).

	 Identify the six main components of the O*NET Content Model; Navigate O*NET OnLine to find career clusters and occupations by text or Standard Occupational Classification (SOC); and Navigate My Next Move, including the career profiler, from the perspective of a student and/or job seeker.

Session 2	Taking a Deeper Dive into the O*NET Standards			
2 - 3 p.m. To receive the webinar link, <u>register here.</u>	Improve your students' passing rates on technical skills exams for industry credentials with a deeper dive into O*NET's occupation-specific data. This session builds on the O*NET exploration in session one, Exploring the O*NET Standards, to learn how to interpret and apply reports on occupation-specific information from O*NET OnLine. Learn how O*NET's data on occupational requirements and characteristics can help you prioritize skills for lesson planning, create realistic work scenarios, and motivate learners with job prospects. This session also introduces additional sources for industry information including PD Bulletins crafted for IE&T providers in Washington DC.

Session 3	Increasing Equity with Northstar Digital Literacy			
10 - 11 a.m. To receive the webinar link, <u>register here</u> .	Northstar Digital Literacy offers assessments, instructor led curricula, and self-directed online practice lessons on foundational digital literacy skills in 15 different topic areas including Basic Computers, Internet Basics, Using Email, Windows 10, Mac OS, Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint, Google Docs, Social Media, Information Literacy, Accessing Telehealth Appointments, Your Digital Footprint, Distance Learning Platforms, and Career Search Skills. At the end of each assessment, the learner receives results page that lists the skills that have been mastered and the skills that can be enhanced. These skills are then aligned with the curricula and practice lessons to allow learners and instructors to focus on the areas for growth potential.			
	 Learning Objectives - Participants will be able to: Use the Northstar Digital Literacy Standards to determine learning needs; Explore the Northstar Digital Literacy instructor led curriculum and self-directed online practice lessons; Use the Northstar Digital Literacy assessments to pre- and post-test students' computer skills; and Learn about the certificates and badges that students can earn to document their computer skills.

Session 4	Individualize Skill Building with IXL Learning

The IXL Learning platform is a personalized digital learning space with a K-12 curriculum that has more than 9,000 skills in math, English language arts, science, social studies, and Spanish. By using real-time diagnostics, a comprehensive curriculum, individualized lessons, and actionable analytics, this instructional resource, provided by OSSE Adult and Family Education to DC providers and partners, can be used to create personalized learning plans for older youth and adult learners in adult education, Integrated Education & Training, and/or workforce programs. Many K-12 students in the District use IXL Learning, so parents who use it to accelerate their own learning have the added benefit of being able to support their children in navigating through this user-friendly software. <i>(This session is equivalent to IXL Foundations I.)</i>

The app helps educators and trainers find strategies, resources, and activities to support meaningful edtech integration and digital skill development by implementing instructional routines and applying them during the learning experience. These instructional routines include: Engage & Question, Build Knowledge, Process & Practice, Respond & Create, and Reflect & Assess.
